Martin Eckhardt – served in the Navy during the Vietnam War. He was stationed in the Pacific.

Jack Gardner – Master Sgt. In the Marines during WWII. He repaired aircraft in the Pacific.

Morgan Huglen – drafted into the Army in WWII and served as a Sergeant in the Philippines.

Paul Jones – A Pan American Airway pilot contracted to the Navy and flew 220 crossings to the Pacific during WWII.

Robert Klein Drafted into the Army during WWII and served as a corporal in France and Germany.

Roy Kolak – drafted into the Army during the Korean War. He served two years stateside.

Chet Krause – served in the Army during WWII with an Antiaircraft Battalion stationed in Europe. He has written a book on his experiences with the 565th AAA.

Frank Roovers – Served in the Navy and was stationed in South America.

Robert Tock – served as an Army Ranger with the rank of sergeant during the Korean War.

David Uselding – drafted into the Army in the Vietnam War. He served two years stateside.

Chuck Zimmerman (ILA van driver) – served in the Navy after Korean War.

Elaine Krause was also recognized. She served as a welder during WWII helping build submarines in the Manitowoc shipyards.
