

The Iola American Legion was Chartered in 1927

The American Legion Post 14 was originally named after Barnard "Barney" Sheveland, when it was first Chartered on August 12, 1927 as **The American Legion Barney Sheveland Post 14**, Barney was Killed-in-Action during World War I and was from Scandinavia.

The Iola American Legion Auxiliary was Chartered in 1927

The American Legion Post Auxiliary 14 was originally named after Barnard "Barney" Sheveland, when it was first Chartered three months after the American Legion was chartered, on November 12, 1927 as **The American Legion Auxiliary Barney Sheveland Post 14**, Barney Sheveland was Killed in Action during World War I and was from Scandinavia.

The American Legion Barney Sheveland Post 14 was Re-Chartered in 1947

In World War II, Donald Taylor from Iola was Killed-in-Action on November 9, 1942, by enemy bombers in Northern Africa. The American Legion Post 14, was re-chartered from **Barney Sheveland Post 14** on November 8, 1947 after World War II as **The American Legion Sheveland-Taylor Post 14**, to show that the American Legion Post 14 represents both Iola & Scandinavia Veterans, and is one of the oldest American Legion Posts in Wisconsin.

The American Legion Auxiliary Barney Sheveland post 14 was Re-Chartered in 1947

In World War II, Donald Taylor from Iola was Killed-in-Action on November 9, 1942, by enemy bombers in Northern Africa. The American Legion Post 14, was re-chartered from **The American Legion Auxiliary Barney Sheveland Post 14** on April 5, 1948 after World War II as **The American Legion Auxiliary Sheveland-Taylor Post 14**, to show that the American Legion Post 14 represents both Iola & Scandinavia Veterans, and is one of the oldest American Legion Posts in Wisconsin.
