

Lafayette 9-11 Baseball captured the Section 1 tournament and advanced to the Northern California Championships where they placed 3<sup>rd</sup>.

North Oakland/South Oakland Senior Baseball competed in the West Region Tournament and placed 2<sup>nd</sup> losing the championship game to Hawaii.

### Bouncing Back

All leagues were devastated by the pandemic of 2020. In the year (2021) following Covid the District saw a loss of 26% of the players from the year prior to the outbreak. Our local leagues saw a drop-off of between 13% and 42%. The District in 2019 had over 7000 children participating in Little League. The year after Covid the number was down to 5000.

2022 saw an uptick of 18% across the District and in 2023 the District saw an additional increase of 7%. By the end of this past season, we have seen numbers rise to 6500 players.

The District's high water mark over the past 16 seasons was 2016 when we had over7500 players participating.


If the District can see a 7% growth this coming season, we can come close to recuperating all of the losses due to Covid.

Reach out to all of your local schools and fellow youth organizations to spread the word about your programs. Consider adding a program you currently do not offer. There is a great opportunity to add a Senior Baseball program in 2024. Senior players DO NOT need to participate in a regular season. This allows a Junior Varsity team from one of vour local schools to enter our postseason tournament. The winner of our postseason tournament automatically advances to the Western Region Tournament. The runner up of the District Tournament would advance to the section tournament with a chance to continue their march to the Western Region Tournament.

Also, look to expand your tee ball programs. There are no more enthusiastic parents than those of these young athletes. They also tend to be some of the best volunteers. Another great aspect of tee ball is that there is no need for umpires, games are generally an hour long, and everyone goes home happy (provided the snacks are not forgotten).

Finally, if you do not have a Challenger program you are missing out on some of the most joyous kids to play all of sport.



### Is your league ready for AB 506?

On January 1,2024 all youth sports organizations in the state of California must begin compliance with AB 506. This law was originally set to go into effect in 2022, but due to overwhelming demand on the California Department of Justice the implementation was delayed until this coming January. The law mandates that all volunteers within your league have their fingerprints taken and have their background checks performed.

Do not put your league at financial risk for failing to comply with the new law. All board members in a given league could be held personally liable for any future lawsuit brought against a league and an individual who is accused and convicted of a sexual offense.

Perform due diligence and have your league and all volunteers take care of this responsibility.

### A letter from Pat Wilson to all local leagues.

In an effort to keep local league/district informed about any major changes that will affect our overall Little League<sup>®</sup> operations, we wanted to provide an update relating to our long-standing relationship with AIG Insurance for our local league insurance program.

After receiving notice from AIG earlier this summer, we were advised that they will not be renewing some of our insurance policies for the 2024 term (1/1/2024 effective dates). At this time, the policies being non-renewed are the following: League General Liability (GL), District General Liability, and League Crime. However, AIG will continue to provide Accident Insurance Coverage and Directors & Officers (D&O) policies for the local leagues under our existing program. As a reminder, your current insurance policies throuah Little League's insurance program are in effect through December 31, 2023.

Since receiving this news, we have been working diligently to fill these gaps with other insurance carriers. It is our goal for a seamless transition to another carrier so that most importantly, our local leagues are not affected and are able to utilize the best insurance program to support their Little League program at an affordable cost.

Your league will be receiving a notice of non-renewal letter from AIG in the near future relating to these policies. You do not need to take any action once you receive that notice. As soon as a new insurance carrier is in place, you will receive information from us on how to proceed to enroll in insurance coverage for the 2024 season, and we are committed to communicating with you throughout this process, including any potential implications to chartering for the 2024 season and the ASAP program.
