

This is a reminder to all the leagues of recurring violations we are seeing in various divisions of baseball and softball. I will be sending this out to your League UICs to be sent down to all umpires. And remember, the below list will be points of emphasis for TOC and All Stars.

Pre-game:

- 1. All players handling a bat, or near a bat, must wear a batter's helmet.
- 2. Umpires are required to do a pre-game equipment inspection of all bats, helmets, and catcher's helmets.

During the game:

- 1. Too many batters out swinging bats between innings. In Major and Minors, only one batter is allowed out between innings, and in 50/70 and above, only two batters are allowed out between innings.
- Players can only have a bat in their hands if they are returning the bat to the rack after an at-bat or picking one up to go out to bat.
- 3. There must be an adult in the dugout at all times there is a player or players in the dugout.
- Base coaches are not allowed to take their base coaching positions until after the catcher throws down the ball to second base at the end of warm-ups.
- Coaches are not allowed to leave the dugout to wander behind the backstop to watch pitches or wander in the stands. A third coach who is used in the dugout during offense, may not sit in the stands when the team is on defense.
- 6. An inning may not begin until there are two base coaches in their respective coaching boxes.
- 7. Youth umpires who do not have a game coordinator assigned to that particular game.

Equipment:

- 1. Pine tar on bats and helmets, even if dried, is illegal.
- 2. We are still finding illegal 1.15. bpf bats in baseball.
- 3. All catcher's helmets must have a dangling throat guard; otherwise they must be removed fr
- 4. All fields must be supplied with breakaway bases.

Tournament Umpires Needed

Soon the tournament season will be here! Leagues should be working to identify and No handling of bats in the dugout. prepare their umpires who they plan to use in the postseason. Each league that participates in All Stars, Tournament of Champions, or Future Stars will be expected to provide their fair share of umpires based upon their share of total number of teams in each tournament. Leagues will be expected to provide umpires for softball as well if they have teams in those divisions. Many leagues rely upon paid umpires from outside sources, or upon youth umpires during the regular season. These leagues will still be expected to provide enough qualified umpires for their share of the tournament games. A list of games in TOC and All Stars assigned to leagues to provide umpires will be sent to League Chief Umpires in mid- May. Leagues should begin to identify their tournament umpires now and provide those nominations to the District Chief Umpire by May 10.

Qualifications for **Tournament Umpires**

Tournament umpires should meet a minimum set of qualifications to be assigned to games:

Adult or youth umpires are encouraged; -

however, each game must have at least one adult umpire assigned. In TOC for the Minor levels of Baseball and in Future Stars two youth umpires may be assigned to a game, but the league assigned to umpire the game must also provide a qualified Game Coordinator. This Game Coordinator will accompany the youth umpires to the game site and be in attendance at that game for its duration.

Umpires must be active regular season umpires for their home league, and have completed the Volunteer Application, had a background check performed, and have been approved by the league Board.

Umpires must have completed the required safety and youth protection training and participated in District 4 postseason umpire training for this season.

Umpires must be properly uniformed for the games, including umpire shirt, District 4 cap, and umpire pants.

Umpires must agree to not receive any compensation for games in the postseason tournaments.
