Out of Boundary Waiver Requests

Most of these requests are now made directly online through the Data Center.

You will find a tab in the Manage Forms section of the Data Center.

A Redshirt Out-of-Boundary Player Waiver request is for a player who does not meet the residency or school enrollment requirements as outlined in the Little League Official Regulations, Rules, and Operating Policies. If approved, a Redshirt Waiver provides a player REGULAR SEASON ONLY eligibility for One Season with the player eligible for both Regular season and Tournament play in subsequent seasons, provided the player meets Participation and Waiver Requirements which includes the player participating in a minimum of 8 games of his/her team's minimum 12 game regular season. A player must continue to be an active participant in your league annually to qualify for the waiver, if approved.

Players submitted via this form will **ONLY** be considered for Redshirt Eligibility. To make a request for a player to have full eligibility, the Little League Charter Committee will need to review and render such a decision. Please contact your regional office for assistance. It should be noted that players that are submitted for full eligibility consideration are still likely to be approved for redshirt eligibility.

Only Little League's International Charter Committee can approve a league to operate outside of the established rules, regulations and operating policies, which includes any player not meeting the residency or school attendance requirements.

Please ensure all information provided is accurate, including proper home League Identification. With improper information, a request may have to be resubmitted to correct errors causing further delay in this process. Upon your submission of the Redshirt Out-of-Boundary Waiver request, the home league and district

administrator will review the Redshirt Request. Home league support (i.e. release) will be necessary for the player to be considered for Redshirt approval. Without such, the Little League Charter Committee waiver process could be considered.

Once all reviews have been completed, you will be notified via email.

Constitutions

All leagues are required to submit and have approved a league constitution through the data center. Once a league has approved their constitution, it is to be put into the file cabinet on the data center. Once uploaded to the file cabinet it will be reviewed by the regional office. If your constitution is not approved you will receive an email stating what changes need to be made.

If you need help crafting an acceptable league constitution here is a link (sample constitution) to a sample constitution provided by headquarters. You can use this sample to make a qualifying one by simply filling it out.

Make Your League Participants Aware of the Tournament Timing

It is not too early to share the plans for the Post Season tournaments with your participants, as soon as they register. Include the dates and other information in your league calendar and on your website. - Outfield fences are listed as required Having your All Star players or TOC representative not available due to vacations or commitments to other baseball tournaments can be avoided by giving out the information now.



Think About Find Improvements to Enhance Post Season **Tournament Experience**

Now is the time when most of the leagues will begin their Facility Inspections as part of preparing for the new season. As you complete your surveys and identify opportunities for field repairs and improvements, consider the needs for hosting post-season All Star and Tournament of Champions games in your plans. Some items you should prioritize which greatly improves the experience for our players and add to field safety:

- Full size game ready portable mounds for those baseball fields that lack a permanent mound. These game ready and replace dirt mounds in size and feel. There is only one company with portable

mounds that meet the Little League specifications – True Pitch Mounds. They are expensive but make the game experience the best.

- Scoreboards are essential to keep players and spectators informed on game action. They range from manual to portable boards to large field mounted manual or automatic. Consider finding a sponsor to fund the board and put their name on it.
- item for tournament fields. Players want the chance to hit it out of the park so provide them with a fence. Temporary fences range from netting style to more stable plastic fence panels. On a small diamond, a 200-foot distance fence that covers the outfield and the sidelines will enhance the game.
- Sideline fencing to fully enclose your fields, even if just temporary style. Keeping thrown and batted balls inside the field prevents action being stopped and allows players to make the plays.
- Upgrades to home plates, pitching plates and bases. Now is when you should be replacing worn out bases and plates. For pitching plates, make sure to use the proper size where the baseball pitching plate is smaller than the softball plate. Also, if you do softball consider putting in permanent anchors for all three pitching distances so your field can be used at all levels without having to dig up the pitcher's plate each game. For bases, make sure you have the correct Breakaway style. Rogers Bases are the recommended Little League supplier of mounds are required by Little League rules breakaway bases - they were the inventors of the base and while more expensive are proven to be safe and reliable. Consider using the double safety base for first base

for at least softball and perhaps even baseball. If you are buying the safety base, make sure you either replace the anchor system to fit your new base or buy the proper safety base that fits tightly onto your existing anchor.

- Flagpole to display the United States and Little League flags at games.

Tournament Fields

Remember, every league that participates in any of our post season tournaments is expected to provide fields and volunteers to host games. Make this obligation part of your league plan now. Appoint a Post Season Director who will lead this effort for your league. Request field access when submitting your permit applications. Field access is becoming more difficult and costly and we need to all work together to provide the best experience for our players.

Fall Ball for Blues

We had good turnouts for our Fall Ball for Blues sessions In October and November. In case you missed them, go to our YouTube channel, @CAD4, to watch them. We already have clinics schedules for Lafayette and concord on February 15 and 21, and March 1. In addition, we will be holding a one-day, District-wide mechanics clinic on February 22 at Pinole.

Fall Ball, Umpire Registry, Background Checks, and Abuse Awareness Training

Now is also the time to encourage all your umpires from last year to register for the Little League Umpire Registry.
