
Rounding to the <u>nearest hundred</u>: A hundred has *only* zeros to the right \rightarrow of the hundred's place—i.e. zeros in <u>both</u> the ones <u>and</u> tens places.

Here are the rules.

A number that is *already* a 'hundred' rounds to itself.

A number *midway* between two consecutive hundreds rounds to the *greater* of the two.

Any other number rounss to the hundred it is nearest to.



Use the number line above to round the following numbers to the nearest hundred:

859	825	850
847	790	800

You can also round a number to the nearest hundred without drawing a number line. Here's how:

First—decide which two hundreds the number comes between.

Then—look at the number's tens digit.


If the *tens* digit is 0, 1, 2, 3 or 4, round *down* to the lesser of the two hundreds.

If the *tens* digit is 5, 6, 7, 8, or 9, round <u>up</u> to the greater of the two hundreds.

Examples:

Round 428 to the nearest hundred. 428 comes between 400 and 500. The tens digit is 2, so round down to 400.

Round 756 to the nearest hundred. <u>7</u>56 comes between <u>7</u>00 and 800. The tens digit is 5, so round up to 800.
