4. The silver chain for Jim's watch cost \$21. This is more than Jim earned in a whole week at work. Do you think that Della was foolish to have spent so much on a fancy gift when the author tells us that Jim was in need of a new coat and gloves? Explain.

5. Why does the author say that Della and Jim are the magi (the wise ones)?

6. Irony is when something turns out totally different than what is expected. O. Henry's stories are noted for their irony—the endings have a surprise twist to them. What is the irony in *The Gift of the Magi*?
