The Legend of the Chinese Zodiac



The Chinese calendar follows a 12-year cycle, called the Zodiac, with each year named after an animal. Here is the story of how the animals were chosen, and how the lowly rat came to have the first year of the Zodiac named for him:

In the race, the animals had to swim across a fast flowing river. The little rat realized that he would have to be very clever if he ever hoped to make it across. So, as soon as the race started, he jumped on the back of the largest and strongest animal he could find—the ox.

The ox turned out to be an excellent swimmer, and the rat travelled safely across the river on its back. Then, just before they reached the other side, the sly rat climbed up over the ox's head and jumped to shore to finish first.

The Jade Emperor was amused by the rat's cunning. He named the first year of the Zodiac after the rat and the second year after the ox. The other animals to make it into the zodiac are the tiger, rabbit, dragon, snake, horse, goat, monkey, rooster, dog and pig—in that order.
