

UNISON: Blessed are you that you did not waver


SOLO: Tell me Lord, how does one who sees the vision see it, through the soul or through the spirit?

[Jehanne] Yeah, exactly. ## On Miracles

[Nancy] There are some what we call miracles, in the Gospel of the Beloved Companion certainly not perhaps as many as in the Canonical gospels. Are you saying that really Yeshua did not perform any miracles perhaps save for them raising Eleazar from the dead?

[Jehanne] No, I'm not saying that. What I am saying is the real miracles that Yeshua performed wasn't changing water into wine; it was changing the nature of the human heart, which I think is far more difficult.

### Discernment vs Accepting on Faith

- I think the important thing with this is to try to find in these stories something that truly makes sense. You see, for something you shouldn't have to go to church and check your discernment and your mind at the door. I think that basically it doesn't make sense, and I'm a great believer in Occam's razor and that the fact is if it doesn't make sense, it's probably not sure.
- Occam's Razor (or Ockham's Razor, also known as the Principle of Parsimony) is the idea that more straightforward explanations are, in general, better. That is, if you have two possible theories that fit all available evidence, the best theory is the one with fewer moving parts.

## Commentary by Rev. Maryesah Karelon, O.M.M.

- As for its significance (Gospel of the Beloved Companion), simply put it could be earthshaking.
- Assuming that it's authentic, it is the only manuscript that I'm aware of that clearly states that Jesus was married and introduces Mary Magdalene as his wife. More importantly, it presents Jesus as clearly giving authority to Mary Magdalene.
- In the context of the famous anointing scene, he proclaims, "I tell you this: when all have abandoned me, only she shall stand beside me like a tower. A tower built on a high hill and fortified cannot fall, nor can it be hidden. From this day forth, she shall be known as **Migdalah**, for she shall be as a tower to my flock, and the time will soon come when her tower **shall stand alone by mine.**" (32:4)
