Be sure all slides move easily and all parts (slide stop nuts, water key springs/corks, valve caps, etc) are on the horn. The summer is a great time to have your horn <u>professionally</u> flushed and chemically cleaned, all worn or missing parts replaced, and all significant dents removed. Your repair shop can also replace missing mute corks at little cost.
