Anniversary Address

It is my great honor to come to you at this moment and share my expressed gratitude and appreciation for the hard work and effort everyone has put into building this organization over the past two years. What started out as a church hosting Sunday and Wednesday night services in late 2009 and early 2010 closed its doors and revamped itself into a missionary style community effort. In the winter of 2010 after months of planning and outlining ideas of how to make this project work, the first Board of Directors was established, chaired by the late Mark Badgett. 10/13/69-11/26/11. This man had the ability to take the fire and passion of a young man with a desire to save the world and shape it into the productive organization that we are today.

Since we began we have helped close to 100 individuals and families with spiritual counseling, drug and alcohol counseling, employment counseling, and marriage and family counseling and have provided them with food, shelter, clothing, hygiene products, a place to wash their laundry, transportation to the grocery and doctor appointments, and so much more. We have networked with many organizations all over the state of Kentucky and around the country to get our name and our services out into the community. We have received tremendous feedback and support from many networking agencies.

We have had a great many volunteers come and go since 2010 who have provided their support and ideas to make this organization what it is today. And today I want to acknowledge John Sensbach, John "Chip" Gillock III and Frank Eldridge for being there with me from day one and never giving up on me or the call to help others. I would also like to give a special thanks to Carl Thomas, David Williams, and William Anderson for their countless hours of support on minor projects that I could not do on my own.

We have received a great number of donations from the Jones family, Atkinson family and many more to help those in need. We also achieved our goal of becoming an official non-profit organization at the state level on November 1, 2011 in Frankfort, KY. Paperwork is under revision by Tad Myer, Attorney-at-Law, to move forward with our 501c(3) application to the Internal Revenue Service so that we may in the near future begin receiving grants, scholarships and others funding to help those in the community.

This summer the Universal Life Church & The S.O.U.L Clinic of Kentuckiana Inc. Science of Understanding Life will be teaming up with Stithton Baptist Church in Radcliff, Kentucky to do a Men's Ministry and get out into the community more and help those who are unable to help themselves by doing lawn care, house cleaning and more.

In our Louisville branch, We are working diligently with the Occupy protest to help many homeless people get back on their feet by networking with many community agencies and finding homes, jobs, and more for each of the homeless persons in that area.

It simply amazes me how much we have done already in just two years and how much more we will soon be capable of doing and will do in the years to come. Again, I could not do this on my own. If not for the support of the previous mentioned people and those in the future who will get involved, this organization could not continue to do what it has done, which is to make sure every homeless person, jobless person, uneducated person, reaches his or her goal. And every lost person finds a true path to enlightenment.

After reading this newsletter, I hope that you will feel inspired to come on board and volunteer your time to help others. There is always something to do. From office work to field duty, you are needed here.
