The Steamboat Rock City Council met in regular session February 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021, 6:30 p.m. with City Council in chambers and available via zoom due to COVID-19 restrictions. Present were Mayor Stearns and the following council members: Adam Blackburn, Jackie Hagberg, Kevin Pieters, Cory Schurman and Wren Hoffman, absent: no one. Also present were Melissa Johanson, Jerry Hoffman, Heidi Young, Todd Fleming, Neicko Deemer and Renee Oltrogge.

Mayor Stearns called the meeting to order. Schurman moved, seconded by Pieters to approve the posted agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: no one.

Schurman moved, Hagberg seconded the motion to approve the City bills as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: no one.

Hoffman moved, Pieters seconded the motion to approve the January 11 & 25, 2021 minutes with no corrections. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: no one.

Hours were presented for Renee Oltrogge, City Clerk and Kelly Haskins, Water/Sewer Supervisor. Hagberg moved, Blackburn seconded the motion to approve hours as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: no one.

Heidi Young requested to approve the liquor license for Happenings. Pieters moved, Hagberg seconded the motion to approve as presented. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: no one.

Neicko Deemer requested approval of the July 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021 Pine Lake Festival Motorcycle & Vendor Show with the income donated to Steamboat Rock Fire Department. May ask to rent the gym to house additional vendors. Market St would be blocked and utilized from in front of the Schoolhouse, to west of the Library to accommodate a greater attendance. Blackburn suggested overflow parking at the ball diamond and possibly fireworks. Concerning alcohol consumption, Deemer advised same plan as last year with Hardin County Sheriff staff presence and Happenings staff monitoring drinking with wrist bands to help identify qualified individuals. Schurman moved, Blackburn seconded the motion to approve as presented for street closures. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: no one.

Melissa Johanson, Director of the Steamboat Rock Library presented her report. Plan to begin replacing aged out computers. Blackburn suggested schools may be willing to help with the computers. Blind Date with a Book Program has been in process and will have drawing on 2/13/21. Schurman moved, Hagberg seconded the motion to approve PO #201202101, 201202102, 201202103 & 201202104 with the removal of Happenings bill. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: none.

Scott Williams, Fire Chief provided his report. January monthly meeting canceled by weather. Debriefed Monday, Feb. 8th @ the Wellsburg FD for the Hwy 20 accident that occurred on Feb. 4th, 2021. Thank you to those that have donated their cans to the redemption bin. Plan to discuss the annual fundraiser at the next monthly meeting. Hagberg moved, Schurman seconded the motion to approve PO #2. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: none.

JJ Veld presented the public works report. A new blower was installed on the sewer for aeration and the following week they fixed the electrical on the other blower. Lift station repair is on pending warmer weather.

Update on distressed properties: Mayor Stearns advised for 101 & 103 E Main St a petition has been filed to obtain court dates by City Attorney. 205 6<sup>th</sup> St was reviewed externally by Mayor & a council person and several items need to be repaired. The history of the property shows this has been deemed as unlivable since 1992. City will send a second notice with a specific list of concerns. 208 3<sup>rd</sup> St a petition has been filed with the IRS with expected city possession by mid- April. 305 4<sup>th</sup> St is a mobile home that is vacant and the city will send a second notice with a specific list of concerns.

Superintendent of Janitorial Services interviewed and recommended by Mayor and City Clerk. Schurman moved, Hagberg seconded the motion to approve the applicant and terminate current contract. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: none.

Budget amendment for 2021 and proposed 2022 budget reviewed. Blackburn moved, Pieters seconded the motion to approve Budget and Resolution 21-01. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: none. Roll Call - Blackburn- aye, Hagberg- aye, Hoffman- aye, Pieters-aye and Schurman- aye. Absent – none.

Five Year City Strategic Plan Mayor Stearns would like to defer discussion until next meeting to let The Visionary Group meet and report back with the city.

Gym has been open for adult walking and one group has utilized it. Supervised Saturday open gym for minors has not yet started Another party has supervised open gym on Sunday afternoons.

City Code Permits discussed per Council interpretation of a structure. Schurman and Pieters discussed removing remodel and repair from the code and focus on new construction. Hoffman advised removing a word or adding a word will help with clarity on this code and suggests we obtain more information. Mayor Stearns advised we need to focus on what is done to a property that increases the assessed value and will do research with the County Assessor.

Iowa Ride discussed. Website has not been updated since May 2020 and contact attempts have failed.

Hardin County Visitors Guide advertising was discussed and will be done.

REAP Grant for Pine Ridge County Campground Sewer Project. Mayor Stearns advised the cost estimate is \$330,000.00 and the Hardin County Conservation is asking the City to apply for a REAP Grant to help with the sewer system for a non-matching \$50,000.00. This County project may not get funding until after 2021. County has a plan for keeping the Pine Ridge Campground functional in the interim. Schurman moved, Pieters seconded the motion to approve a grant application. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: none.

Mayor Stearns suggested using the replacement of a section of the downtown Market street sidewalk to promote more community involvement via volunteers since the City only has the funds available for the materials. Schurman suggested we wait until June to review the budget. Pieters advised the highest pedestrian traffic usage is on the south side of Market St. Mayor Stearns advised there was plenty to do, let's just get started on a section. Blackburn advised we are such a small town we don't need sidewalks in the residential areas. Mayor Stearns suggested we promote bike trail parking in the downtown area to bring people to downtown businesses. Possibly provide public restrooms near the proposed trail parking.

Hoffman moved to adjourn the meeting, Schurman seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: no one. Meeting adjourned at 9:17 pm.
