Summary of the terms:

The City of Steamboat Rock acknowledged a violation of Iowa Code chapter 21. It approved the informal resolution at its October 11, 2021, Council meeting and included the full text in its minutes. A copy of the minutes has been provided to the IPIB on December 14, 2021. The City's attorney requested that his client meet a second time regarding this resolution to ratify their previous action to clarify their acknowledgement. This meeting is scheduled to take place on February 16, 2022 and the minutes will be provided to the IPIB on February 17, 2022.

The Mayor and the Clerk prepared a check list of the steps and procedures needed for a closed session as outlined in Iowa Code section 21. A copy of this check list has been provided to the IPIB on December 14, 2021. On December 13, 2021, the council members and city officials participated in training led by the Iowa League of Cities. The minutes of this meeting were provided to the IPIB on December 14, 2021.

The proof of compliance has been provided. Therefore, the IPIB should dismiss this complaint as successfully resolved.
