Tips for Managing Your Passwords

Passwords are the key to almost everything you do online, and you probably have multiple passwords that you use throughout the day. Choosing hard-to-hack passwords and managing them securely can sometimes seem inconvenient. Fortunately, there are simple ways to make your passwords as secure as possible. Doing so can keep hackers from taking over your accounts and prevent theft of your information (or money from online banking!).



Never reveal your passwords to others.

You probably wouldn't give your ATM card and PIN to a stranger and then walk away. So, why would you give away your username and password? Your login credentials protect information as valuable as the money in your bank account.

Use different passwords for different accounts. That way, if one account is compromised, at least the others won't be at risk.

Use Multi-factor authentication (MFA). Even the best passwords have limits. Multi-Factor Authentication adds another layer of protection in addition to your username and password. Generally, the additional factor is a token or a mobile phone app that you would use to confirm that you really are trying to log in.

Length trumps complexity. The longer a password is, the better. Use at least 16 characters whenever possible.

Make passwords that are hard to guess but easy to remember.

To make passwords easier to remember,

use sentences or phrases. For example, "breadandbutteryum". Some systems will even let you use spaces: "bread and butter yum".

Avoid single words, or a word preceded or followed by a single number (e.g. Password1).

Don't use information in your password that others might know about you or that's in your social media. (e.g. birthdays, children's or pet's names, car model, etc.). If your friends can find it, so will hackers.

Complexity still counts. To increase complexity, include upper- and lower-case letters, numbers, and special characters. A password should use at least 3 of these choices. To make the previous example more secure: "Bread & butter YUM!"

Use a password manager. Password management tools, or password vaults, are a great way to organize your passwords. They store your passwords securely, and many provide a way to back-up your passwords and synchronize them across multiple systems.



I expected him to ease out of the driveway and

The Joy in History

I've now been an active member of the Steamboat Rock Historical Society for over 23 years, and I continue to get a lot of enjoyment in serving our community in this way. This past 60 days I have again been reminded of why enjoy it so much. Let me share a few of my experiences from the last 60 days:

- I've been in contact with a lady from Door County Wisconsin for nearly 9 years in regard to her ancestors coming from this area of the United States. She was finally able to come to Steamboat Rock just recently. My wife and I spent an entire day with her taking her to various spots near Steamboat Rock. We discovered the following: (1)-the gravesite of her great-great grandparents in the Hauser Cemetery near Union. (2)-the gravesite of her great-great-great-greatgrandparents at the Eldora Cemetery. (3)-the possible site and actual cabin of her great-great grandparents east of Gifford. (We later found out that this cabin was a stagecoach stop way back in the mid 1850's.) (4)-She also had a map that her grandmother had drawn of the locations of some of the homes in Steamboat Rock back in the early 1900's. These homes included the Turner's, "Old Man Haas", the Gellhorn's, the Cartwrights and included the locations of hotel, the telephone office, three churches, the school, and the blacksmith shop. (5)- And she gave me copies of her grandmother's journal that she had wrote about her time living in Steamboat Rock. My wife and I so very much enjoyed this day of helping this lady discover her roots. She is planning on coming back next summer to spend an entire week here.
- This past month, Chester Klatt, a new member of SRHS, discovered some pictures of life in Steamboat Rock that none of us had seen before. Whenever we find new pictures it is a joy to both discover them and then be able share them with the community. Stop in sometime and see them for yourselves. Again, thank you to Chester for finding these pictures.
- Kitty Hemmen gave me a copy of a journal written by Marie (Chaudat) Gast that told of how she came from France to Steamboat Rock in 1920. It was so interesting to read. And what made it special for me was that she was my babysitter and lived just one block away from where I now live. Her story is amazing.
- Grace Starr has been working on an exhibit to honor the Veterans of Steamboat Rock who served during the Vietnam War Era. It is so very interesting to read the stories of these men who risked their lives to serve our country.

This was all in the past 30-60 days. I find a lot of joy in helping others discover their roots and also finding more about events that helped to shape my life. If you are looking for a little more joy in your life, consider helping out at the Steamboat Rock Historical Society.

The Steamboat Rock City Council met in regular session on August 15, 2024 at City Hall. Meeting was called to order by Mayor Dave Mull at 6:00 PM with council members Kevin Pieters, Travis Hollander, Marc Havens and Marvin Veld in attendance. Cory Schurman was absent.

Kevin Pieters made the motion to approve the agenda and was seconded by Marc Havens. Motion carried.

Comments and concerns from the Public; Jim Kramer talked to the council concerning the concept of an All School Reunion/Weekend Celebration of Steamboat Rock. He represented the Historical Society and was asking for the City's support and help for this undertaking. The plans are for the Weekend Celebration to take place in 2026. There is also support from the Visionary Group of Steamboat Rock. Council said they would discuss help & support in the future when plans start for the event.

Kevin Pieters also brought a concern from a resident, Les Winther concerning placing a fence on his property and what his boundaries were for doing so.

REPORTS:

Library: no report

Fire Department: Truck door that was damaged has been okay to rebuild. Should be receiving the two torpedoes with the next couple of weeks, they are to help the department put out fires faster and safer. Department is working on mapping out the territory that is covered by the department to help aid in fire calls. Also purchase 6 new batteries for equipment. Accepted the resignation of Harrison Lippert, he is moving to Mason City. Fire Chief Scott Williams recommended that Steamboat Rock residents check with their insurance concerning their premiums because of the "dual page" which means when the department is called there is also a second department called to assist with mutual aid.

Public Works: Shannon was filling in for Will while he is on vacation. He is working on cleaning at the sewer plant.

Kevin Pieters made the motion to approve the Minutes from last month's meeting and was seconded by Marc Havens. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Kevin Pieters to approve the bills presented and seconded by Marv Veld. Motion carried.

After discussion, Kevin Pieters motioned to approve the hours and was seconded by Marv Veld. Motion carried.

Discussion concerning the hours, motion was made by Marv Veld not to pay the librarian for attending council meetings and to deduct the ½ hour for July's meeting that was included on payroll; this also includes all departments of the city going forward, excluding City Clerk (this being part of the clerk's duties). Motion was second by Travis Hollander. Motion carried.

Old Business: East door to City Hall; door has to be operational in accordance with the fire code. Looking in to what needs to be done to make the door work properly.

Search Grant has been approved and funds will be transferred upon completion of final paperwork being submitted.

New Business: Hardin County Savings Bank account. Kevin Pieters made the motion to keep the account open and use for funds from gym rental. Motion was seconded by Marc Havens. Motion carried. I will proceed to get the account updated.

IAS propane contract for 2024-25 season. Kevin Pieters motioned to book for 1631 gallons. Motion was seconded by Marv Veld. Motion carried.

Property clean-up – Moved to September meeting for closed session.

Street Repairs – Council discussed getting a second bid. Will has bid to do the removal and replace and should start work next month.

Promotion of the School/Gym – Have some interest in using the gym for kids basketball practice and possible tournaments. Council would like to make some improvement to facilitate interest in the property.

Lead – Water service information: Shannon proposed that we post to the newsletter and note on water invoices for residents to submit a picture, of the water service entrance into the property, to the city hall email (srcityhall@heartofiowa.net) or call city hall if they have questions, concerns or would like to schedule for someone to check their service. This is a requirement from the EPA and is due by October 16, 2024.

Budget review was postponed until September meeting.

Trees – The Visionary Group had requested assistance in treating diseased trees last month and council voted not to support the issue but proposed to help in purchasing replacement trees instead. Motion was made by Marc Havens to give a monetary donation to the Visionary Group to purchase trees. Motion was seconded by Travis Hollander. Motion carried.

Street Light Replacement: Alliant Energy contacted city hall concerning the street light at SW intersection of 4th and Madison. Pole was damaged and it was costly to the city to replace the pole and install the new light. It was more cost effective for the city to move the light to the Northside pole. Motion was made by Kevin Pieters to pass the resolution to give permission for Alliant to move the light to the north side pole at 4th and Madison. Travis seconded the motion. Roll call vote was taken with four votes for, and none opposed. Cory Schurman was absent. Resolution carried.

Future Items for Agenda: Budget, Street Repairs, Closed session (concerning property cleanup)

Marc Havens motioned to adjourn the meeting at 7:40 PM. Kevin Pieters seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Next meeting is September 9, 2024
