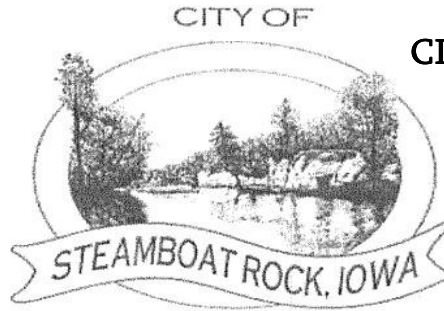

The City of Steamboat Rock council met June 9, 2025 for their regular monthly meeting. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 with Mayor David Mull, Council members Kevin Pieters, Cory Schurman, Travis Hollander, Marc Havens and Marvin Veld present. Kevin Pieters motioned to approve the agenda with Cory Schurman seconding the motion. Motion passed.

COMMENTS AND CONCERNS: Jake Murphy from the Steamboat Rock Baptist Church presented the plan for lights to be installed at the church parking lots. Informed the council that the church had spoken with the residents that might be impacted by the lights and that the way the light will be positioned should not shine directly into any homes and that the lights will either be on a timer or auto shut-off. Council informed Jake that no permit would be required.

Mayor David Mull informed the council that the library was having issues with lime scale in the bathroom toilet and suggested that they needed a water softener to alleviate the problem. The city clerk will check on prices for Culligan to install and maintain a water softener and give the information to the Library to make the decision how they want to proceed.

Also the mayor informed the council that Will Venenga will now only be a fill in for the water department. The duties will be split between Mayor Mull and Shannon Hazelton, water supervisor.

REPORTS:

LIBRARY: Johnnie sent a report for the library stating that they received a \$1500.00 grant from the Christian's Women's United to start a new large print section patrons seem excited. The summer kickoff party served over 70 walking tacos; thank you to JD and the sheriff's department for bringing a car and the Steamboat Rock fire department for bringing a fire truck. Summer reading started last Friday and have 2 enhanced activities through July 19th.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: Scott Williams reported that they are looking to purchase a newer grass truck and to sell (by bid) the old grass truck. Also stated that the flooring upstairs at the department is in bad shape and would like to replace it. He will do some checking on pricing to get it replaced. Billing has been sent out for the CRP burns completed by the department. Austin Williams is now full time on the department. June 21st the department will be doing testing on the hoses.

PUBLIC WORKS: Shannon was not able to attend but Dave gave an update. They are still having some issues with the clarifier but otherwise no major issues.

Marc Havens motioned to approve the minutes with Cory Schurman seconding the motion. Motion passed. Cory Schurman motioned to approve the bills for payment and Kevin Pieters second the motion. Motion passed. Cory Schurman motioned to approve the employee hours with Travis Hollander seconding the motion. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS: Budget amendment. Cory Schurman made to motion to pass a resolution #2025-02 to amend the FY2025 budget. Motion was second by Kevin Pieters. Kevin Pieters, Cory Schurman, Marc Havens, Travis Hollander and Marvin Veld all voted for the resolution, none were opposed.

Kevin Pieters motioned to approve building permit for Brandon Dilley with Marc Havens seconding the motion. Motion was approved.

NEW BUSINESS:

Shane Blythe of Blythe Sanitation was present. He was there to inform the council that as of July 1, 2025 McDowell Sanitation Services would be taking over from Blythe. He would like the city to extend the contract for 5 years from the date of the existing contract which ends January 31, 2027 and transfer it to McDowell's. After some discussion, Cory Schurman made the motion to extend the contract for the additional 5 years and transfer to McDowell's, with Travis Hollander seconding the motion. Motion passed. This will extend the contract to the year 2032.

James Sweeney from CGA was present to give the finding for the engineering report for the proposed sewer project. Council gave the consent for the report to be sent for approval and in search for grants to complete the project. Motion was made by Kevin Pieters and seconded by Marvin Veld. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Marvin Veld to approve the cigarette permit for The Rock Stop. Motion was seconded by Travis Hollander. Motion passed.

DNR Management agreement was tabled until more information concerning the agreement could be researched. It will be placed on July's agenda.

Marc Havens made the motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:20 PM with Kevin Pieters seconding the motion. Motion was approved.
