Why did you become navigators? We wanted to support a first-generation college student.

How do you support your scholar? We send reminders of important program dates, and check in periodically via email and text. We met in person with our scholar before her first semester of college began to help establish a relationship and to let her know that we were available to help and support her in any way.

How has being a navigator impacted you? Since we have become navigators, we have been very impressed with how supportive and proud our scholar's family is of her, and how important that support is for her continued success.



More Fast Facts

- Since 2004, 136 scholarships have been awarded with a total value of \$457,350.
- Charlottesville Scholarships can be renewed annually to support the student through his or her program of study or undergraduate education.
- Scholarships typically begin at \$1,500 with an annual increase of \$500 with successful academic progress.
- Annual grants for renewing scholars are increased to make up for the decline in other financial aid so that students can reduce or eliminate their college-related debt.
- A student can receive up to \$9,000 over the typical 4-year undergraduate program.
- In 2018, CSP will award a total of \$70,150 in scholarships. All award funds are sent directly to the educational institution for application to the scholar's student account.
- CSP provides scholarships to adults who seek to improve their lives through education. Adults can receive initial awards of up to \$1,500 in a year.
- We will be financially assisting 32 students during the 2018-2019 academic year. Many are the first in their family to attend college.

About the Charlottesville Scholarship Program

Established in 2001 with a \$250,000 gift from Charlottesville City Council, the Charlottesville Scholarship Program provides college scholarships to low- and moderate-income graduates of Charlottesville City Schools, and to City employees. We support students through the completion of their course of study, and we support adults who are furthering their education. Scholarships increase each year, which encourages students to complete school, and lessens overall student debt. To date, we have helped 136 students pursue higher education.
