**Why did you become a navigator?** Hearing the ways in which our navigators are able to encourage their scholars while also experiencing the fruitful connections of being a mentor persuaded me to become a navigator also! **How has being a navigator affected you?** I would say twofold: first, being a navigator, and being part of a group of navigators, opens your eyes to the great challenges that our scholars are overcoming in an especially personal way because you see firsthand both how far they've come and where they can go. Second, it is a process that helps to inspire you as you see (or see again) the excitement and new opportunities a young person attending college for the first time experiences and how important it is to approach the rest of life with that same spirit.



## More Fast Facts

- Charlottesville Scholarships can be renewed annually to support the student through his or her program of study or undergraduate education.
- Scholarships typically begin at \$1,500 with an annual increase of \$500 with successful academic progress.
- Annual grants for renewing scholars are increased to make up for the decline in other financial aid so that students can reduce or eliminate their college-related debt.
- A student can receive up to \$9,000 over the typical 4-year undergraduate program.
- In 2019, CSP will award a total of \$67,250 in scholarships. All award funds are sent directly to the educational institution for application to the scholar's student account.
- CSP provides scholarships to adults who seek to improve their lives through education. Adults can receive initial awards of up to \$1,500 in a year.
- We will be financially assisting 33 students during the 2019-2020 academic year. Many are the first in their family to attend college.

## About the Charlottesville Scholarship Program

Established in 2001 with a \$250,000 gift from Charlottesville City Council, the Charlottesville Scholarship Program provides college scholarships to low- and moderate-income graduates of Charlottesville City Schools, and to City employees. We support students through the completion of their undergraduate course of study, and we support adults who are furthering their education. Scholarships increase each year, which encourages students to complete school and lessens overall student debt. To date, we have helped 146 students pursue higher education.
