Established in 2001 with a \$250,000 gift from Charlottesville City Council, the Charlottesville Scholarship Program provides post-secondary scholarships to low- and moderate-income graduates of Charlottesville City Schools and City employees. CSP supports students through the completion of their undergraduate course of study or professional certification program. Scholarships increase each year to encourage students to complete school and to lessen overall student debt. To date, CSP has helped 188 students pursue higher education, providing more than \$961,000 in total scholarship funding.

### Why did you become a Navigator?

To help make a difference in the good work that CSP is doing in our community and in the lives of the scholars it supports, their families, too. As a parent of 3 CHS graduates, and through my work that largely involves engaging with area schools and non-profits, I was well aware of CSP and the opportunities it affords for those who might not have a chance to pursue secondary education otherwise. It was ultimately a call to action that felt meant to be.

### How do you support your scholars?

It is my intention to communicate monthly, touching base on progress in school, how classes are going, and the overall balance of college life, work, and family, too. When they are home on breaks, we try to schedule a time to have coffee and catch up in-person. Each connection comes with encouragement and assurance that, as their Navigator, I am here to provide support and guidance for a positive and successful post-secondary journey, the whole journey long!

### How has being a Navigator impacted you?

It is through these mentoring relationships that I have gained (and it is ongoing) a deeper understanding of how committed these scholars are to succeed academically, personally, and professionally, not only for themselves, but for their families and the community of people who have supported them throughout their lives. I am continually struck by their initiative and determination, passion, and resourcefulness, undeterred and at the same time empowered by life's circumstances. All the CSP scholars are such inspiration, and particularly those I am honored to know as their Navigator. When I think about all that they are navigating, and successfully so, I often say they could be my Navigator!

- In 2023, the Charlottesville Scholarship Program will award over \$115,000 in total scholarships.
- CSP awards may be renewed annually to support the student through his or her program of study.
- Scholarships typically begin at \$2,500 and increase by \$500 annually with successful academic progress.
- A student can receive up to \$13,000 in total CSP support toward a technical certificate or undergraduate degree.
- CSP awards are not just for high school seniors! Adults can also apply for scholarships toward 2-year or 4-year undergraduate degrees or technical certifications.
- · Most CSP scholars are the first in their family to attend college.
