



General Information

The Charlottesville Scholarship Program (CSP) and Grace Tinsley Memorial Scholarship Program offer eligible local residents an opportunity to apply for Charlottesville Promise, Preston Coiner, and Grace Tinsley Scholarships each year by **March 1st**. Scholarships may be used for tuition, fees, and other educational expenses. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered. Personal statements, answers to essay questions, and Preston Coiner local history essays should be the applicant's own work.

Charlottesville Promise Scholarships are renewable awards that can fund up to \$13,000 of the cost of a 2- or 4- year undergraduate degree or for a vocational training/professional certification program at an accredited technical school. First-year awards are typically \$2,500. CSP typically awards 9 new scholarships each year to seniors attending Charlottesville High School and residing in the City, 1 potential new scholarship each year to a graduating high school senior residing in the City and attending one of the City's alternative or non-traditional learning centers listed [here](#), and 1 potential additional new scholarship each year to an eligible adult student currently attending or planning to enroll in a post-secondary undergraduate program or vocational training/professional certification program at an accredited technical school.

Preston Coiner Scholarships are renewable awards, administered through CSP, that may be used for a 2- or 4-year undergraduate degree program. Annual awards are calculated based on a percentage of the funds available in the Preston Coiner scholarship endowment. The Preston Coiner award for 2023 was \$5,900. Only one Preston Coiner award is available in any given year. As the current Preston Coiner Scholar is graduating in 2024, a scholarship will be available in 2024 and applications are welcome by the March 1, 2024 deadline.

Grace Tinsley Scholarships are awarded for a student's first and second years of college. In 2023, first-year awards were \$2,500 and second-year awards were \$1,500. GT typically awards 4 new scholarships each year.

Who is Eligible?

Charlottesville Promise Scholarships

- Low- to Middle-Income Charlottesville City School System graduating high school seniors living in Charlottesville
- Low- to Middle-Income Charlottesville City School System high school graduates living in Charlottesville
- Low- to Middle-Income Charlottesville City School System GED recipients living in Charlottesville
- Low- to Middle-Income City of Charlottesville municipal employees, no matter where they live
- Low- to Middle-Income Charlottesville City School System employees, no matter where they live

Preston Coiner Scholarship

- Low- to Middle-Income graduating high school seniors of a public or private high school in the City of Charlottesville or County of Albemarle who are also current City or County residents

Grace Tinsley Memorial Scholarships

- Low- to Middle-Income Charlottesville High School graduating seniors

Income Eligibility Requirements

The Charlottesville Scholarship Program (Charlottesville Promise Scholarships and Preston Coiner Scholarships) and the Grace Tinsley Memorial Scholarship Program (Grace Tinsley Scholarships) provide undergraduate scholarships to low- and moderate-income people in the Charlottesville community who wish to pursue post-secondary education, but who lack the financial resources to do so. To qualify for these need-based scholarships, the applicant's household income must be lower than the maximum income for the applicant's family size, as shown on the guidelines below. **PLEASE BE SURE TO REDACT ALL SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS FROM ALL SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION PROVIDED WITH YOUR APPLICATION!**
