The two Associations have received safety concerns dealing with water-sport activities such as Water Skiing, Wakeboarding, Tubing, Kayaking, Canoeing, Fishing, Personal Water Motorcrafts and Pontoon Boats .

The Executives are suggesting that we as a Community and, collectively, users of Robertson Lake – come to an agreement that the early morning and evening hours should be afforded to the fishing, canoeing, and kayaking participants. All high-speed motorized water-sports should take place during daylight hours taking into consideration all Lake users who are also in or on the Lake by using COMMON BOATING ETIQUETTE.

There are also several pontoon boats which normally cruise around the Lake at a slow speed.

Furthermore, for safety, caution should be observed at all times – especially rules such as proximity to shorelines, and a mandatory spotter when towing tubes, skiers, boards, etc. – and always protect and respect the distance with regard to wildlife (loons, chicks, ducks, turtles, etc.).

Swimmers outside designated areas should be easily recognizable(per example : brightly colored head gear , attachment of brightly colored balloons) or best accompanied by a boat (close incidents by boats to swimmers have been reported).

We are calling on ALL users of Robertson Lake to respect the pleasure of others – in a safe manner. Thank you
