Logan used his position as commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, a fraternal organization of Union soldiers, to issue a proclamation for a national "Decoration Day" to be observed on May 30 of that year by decorating the tombs of Union soldiers.

The name "Memorial Day," started cropping up from time to time.

The new name became more common after World War II, and in 1967 was declared the official name by Federal law.
