THE MIDWEST CONFERENCE LAY ORGANIZATION J. D. WILLIAMS SCHOLARSHIP

The J.D. Williams Scholarship is to be presented to students who are members of one of our African Methodist Episcopal Churches within the Midwest Conference. Its purpose is to assist worthy young persons of the Christian Faith in obtaining a degree in higher education. The Midwest Conference Lay Organization of the African Methodist Episcopal Church will administer the funds for this scholarship.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. An active member of an African Methodist Episcopal Church within the Midwest Conference.
- 2. Must have a GPA of 2.5 or better.
- 3. Must enter college, university, trade or vocational school program in the summer or fall of 2025.

THE SELECTION PROCESS

A judging committee composed of members of the Midwest Conference, or their designee, will use established requirements to determine the scholarship recipients. The judges will evaluate eligible applicants: academic record; reference letters; qualities of leadership; extracurricular activities and accomplishments. The recipients will be notified in writing if selected. All decisions by the judges are final. No material will be returned. Applications not completed in full or not received by the deadline will not be processed.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT

The scholarship winner(s) will be announced at the organization's Annual Lay Convention. Proof of enrollment must be received by the organization for the final awarding of the scholarship(s). If appropriate documentation is not received by the end of the conference year, scholarship funds will be returned to the organization's general scholarship fund.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The following documents must be submitted:

- 1. The completed application form **must** be typed or printed (legible) in ink and signed by Pastor and Lay President.
- 2. 300-500-word essay on the topic: "The Value of Retaining Black History as Part of American History in the 21st Century".
- 3. A sealed envelope with the current high school transcript, signed with an official stamp mailed directly to the Scholarship Committee. **No copies accepted**. Mail transcript to:

- 4. A minimum of two letters of reference.
 - One letter must be from your current Pastor or President of your Local Lay Organization.
 - Additional letters of recommendation are encouraged and may be from a High School Teacher; Principal;
 Counselor or other community leader.
 - Each letter must be addressed specifically to the J. D. Williams Scholarship.
- 5. A Resume of Activities/Involvement.
- 6. Local Lay Organization's Fair Share must be paid to be eligible.

A review of all listed materials by the Local Lay President, Pastor, or a member of the Local Lay Organization prior to submitting to the Scholarship Committee is advised.

THE COMPLETED APPLICATION AND REQUIRED MATERIALS MUST BE RECEIVED/POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN MAY 10, 2025.

Applications will not be considered for the following reasons:

- Incomplete Application and/or failure to submit Information Form or separate resume.
- No current high school transcript.
- Essay is less than 300 words and/or failure to submit essay or submit an essay for another topic.
- Not submitting all required materials by the deadline date.
- Local Lay Organization Fair Share is not paid.
