- Created in 2008
- WorkWell, Inc. & DHHS through the leadership of Lisa Henning.
- 517 companies have been recognized to-date with several companies receiving the award more than once.
- Intent is to create and enhance a healthy Nebraska workforce.







Three Award Levels

- Sower Award
 - The Sower Award is intended to be a stepping-stone to the Grower Award. The Sower Award plants the seed for wellness.
- Grower Award
 - The **Grower Award** rewards businesses for changing health behaviors.
- Harvester Award
 - The Harvester Award is available to businesses that are reaping the benefits of an advanced wellness program and can demonstrate high quality outcomes.





2024 Award Timeline

- January 2024- Governor's Award Application Opens
 - Ongoing peer review throughout the application process
- May 24, 2024 Final Application Deadline
- Fall 2024- Official Announcement of Award Winners
- 2024 recipients will have their choice to accept their award at an award luncheon.

The Governor's Award Advisory Committee is a group of individuals who provide ideas, suggestions, and feedback regarding the award. These wellness professionals bring a wealth of knowledge regarding workplace wellness, specifically the Governor's Wellness Award. Thank you for providing your guidance and encouraging organizations & schools to engage in wellness.



- There is no cost to apply.
- One application for all three award levels
- Recognition:
 - Award recipients are formally notified by the Governor and receive a framed certificate.
 - Worksite representatives are publicly recognized at a banquet of your choice.
 - Media is notified accordingly.
- Award is valid for three years. You can upgrade from Sower to Grower award anytime.
- Award is retroactive, this will be for goals and objectives to be implemented between calendar years 2021-2023. Goals and objectives cannot be from a current 2024 plan and must be completed by Dec. 31, 2023.

- All organizations or schools complete one application! Based on how many points earned will depend on which award level your organization or school will receive.
- The application offers a total of 42 points, plus a bonus point section. To earn an award, each organization or school needs to earn the following points:
 - Sower = 25-33 points
 - Grower = 34-39 points
 - Harvester = 40+ points
