VETERANS

Return to Duty Program CAF participants can be entitled to monthly allowance

Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) members participating in Return to Duty programs outside of their home unit can be entitled to a monthly allowance, according to clarification from a recent CAF memo.

According to CANFORGEN 133/23, "A member who participates in an RTD program outside of the home unit, including in a CAF Transition Centre, but is not posted or assigned and still meets the entitlement conditions of their monthly allowance shall remain entitled to the applicable allowance."

The CANFORGEN was released to clarify the entitlement of monthly allowance for those officers and non-commissioned members posted or attach posted or assigned to a CAF Transition Centre.



APPLY FOR YOUR LICENSE PLATE TODAY

The Veteran license plate is available to those who have honourably served in:

- ➤ Served in the Canadian Armed Forces, including Reserve Forces, the forces of the Commonwealth, or its wartime allies;
- ► Served in the Merchant Navy or Ferry Command during wartime;
- ► Currently serving members of the Canadian Forces including Reserve Forces;
- ► Served in Nato operations or as a member of United Nations peacekeeping force as a member of a Canadian police service;
- ► Currently serving or retired members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police;
- ► Served in the Vietnam War in the forces of the United states or its allies during this war and who was a Canadian citizen at the time of such service.

How to order: Applicants can obtain an "Application for veteran Plate Eligibility Certification" form from any Drivers and Vehicles License Issuing Office. You may also download your form on the Ministry of Transportation website at www.mto.gov.on.ca

Ontario values Veterans contribution, dedication and commitment to serving our country.

CANADA POST Offers Free Shipping for 18th-year



It's that time of year again. If your loved one is deployed overseas, you can send a package full of love and holiday cheer to your military member free of charge. For the eighteenth year, Canada Post provides free regular parcel services for family and friends of Canadian military members deployed overseas. The service will run from Oct. 10 to Jan. 12, 2024.

"Parcels will be delivered free of charge from any Canada Post retail outlet to designated CAF Bases and will then be forwarded through the CAF Postal System to members overseas," stated CANFORGEN 142/23.

In addition, Canada Post will also continue to provide free delivery of letters under 500 grams to deployed troops until Dec. 31, 2024.


