


## 2024 BRANCH 255 LEGION VETERAN BANNER PROJECT UPDATE

The RCAF Centennial flag will be raised at City Hall and the reading of the Mayor's proclamation calling April 1-5 "Royal Canadian Air Force Centennial Week" in a brief ceremony at Windsor's City Hall.

#### RCAF CENTENNIAL CEREMONY – April 7<sup>th</sup>, 1pm at RCL BRANCH 255

A Ceremony and Wreath laying to commemorate the Centennial of the RCAF. Special Guest Speaker is Mr. Don Christopher, President of the Canadian Aviation Museum and Special Guest Veteran, LCol Ronald Holden OMM CD will be in attendance.
