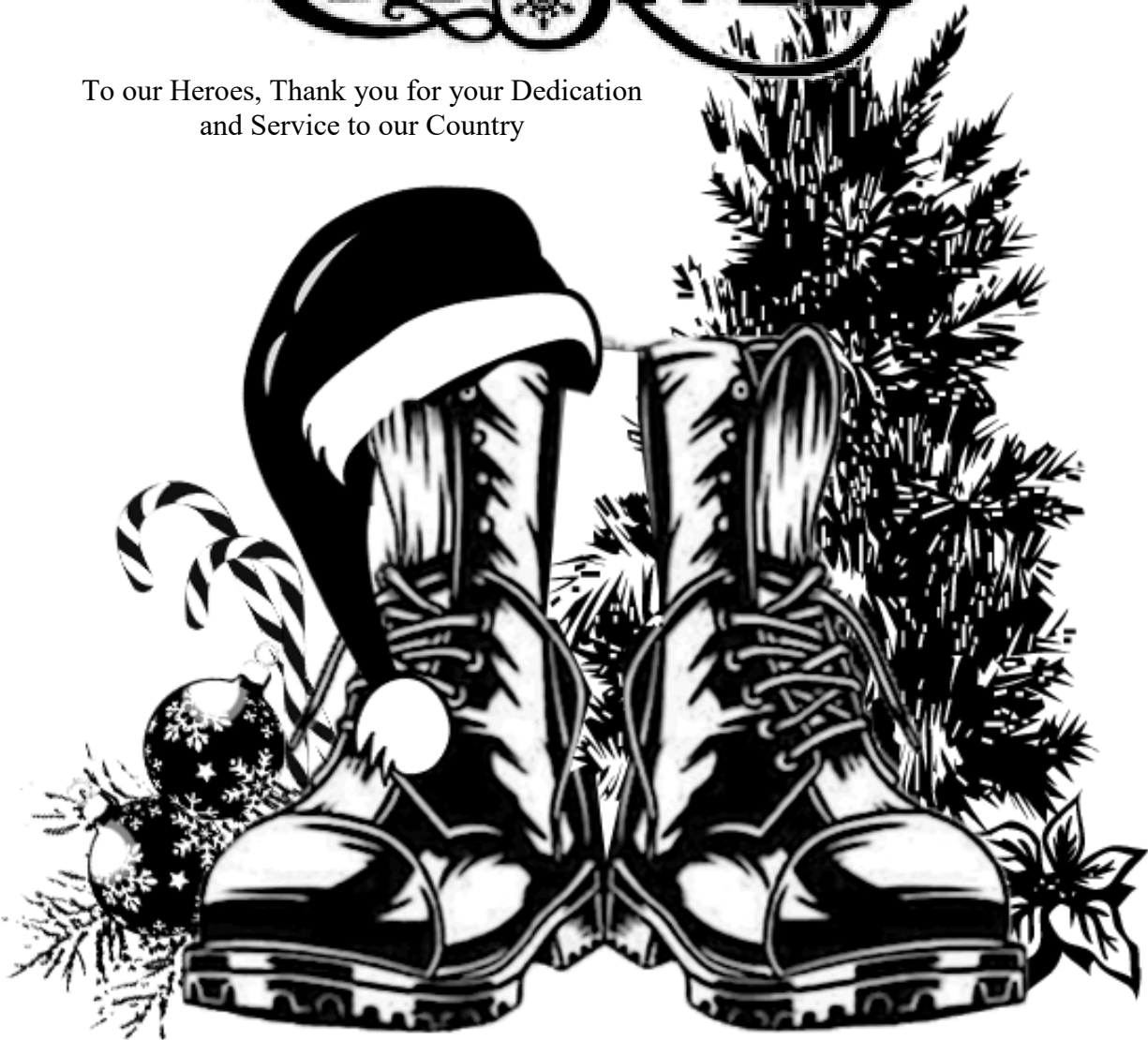

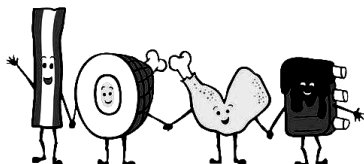
## BINGO REPORT - Kathy Patterson / Chair

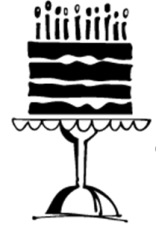


## PARKWOOD HOSPITAL

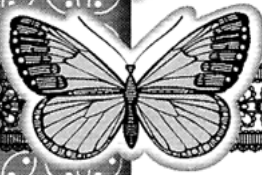
