PRESIDENT REPORT - Bruce Tribute / President

Comrade Ken Marshal (2 nd VP) and I attended the District A Convention at RCL Branch 644. It was a two day event. Reports were read by various Chairs of District Command and some discussion of pertinent issues. Elections were held and Comrade Ed McDowell became the new District "A" Commander with Comrade Dan Gray the Deputy District Commander. Comrade Brenda Deacon-Harris is the District "A" Chair.

It was noted that Legion membership has risen in the past 3 years after a 30 year decline. Some discussion was held regarding the 100th anniversary of the Legion next year, 2026 and suggestions were asked for ideas of how to celebrate it.

The bus that the legions fundraised for has been delivered to Parkwood Institute and is being used regularly to transport Veterans to various places and events, and appointments.

The number of homeless Veterans District Legions have helped keeps improving, as well as the Legion Service Bureau providing appeals for veterans free of charge, where some law firms have been charging for this service. If you are aware of this happening in your area, let us know so Provincial Command can be made aware.

On a sad note, Dominion Command has removed "Quilts of Valour " from the list Of Poppy-eligible programs. Quilts of Valour are a wonderful way to honour our Veterans and the service they gave. Command is suggesting using lottery funds instead.

We, the Branch 255 executive, will be travelling to London 10-13 May for the Provincial Convention. This is a biennial event and should provide some valuable information on the running of your Legion. It is also a voting convention to name your new Provincial executive.

Our own Branch elections were held Sunday, 27 April. Please come out and Support the candidates running for positions. Most positions remained the same... 

TOMB OF THE UNKNOWN SOLDIER

In May of this year, it is **the 25th anniversary** of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Situated before the National War Memorial in Ottawa, Ontario, the tomb is dedicated to Canadian service members and holds the remains of an unidentified Canadian soldier who died in France during the First World War.

The soldier remains unknown and represents the more than 120,000 Canadians who sacrificed and gave their lives in the name of freedom and peace. Take the time to remember and honour all those who served and died for Canada in uniform.




