## Royal Canadian Legion Branch 255 **BURSARY POPPY FUND** - Sharron Jarvis / Bursary Chair



#### **Eligibility**

- 1.Students who are Veterans, children, grandchildren, great– grandchildren, spouses or surviving spouses of Canadian Veterans.
- 2.Must have the Veteran's Service Identification Number. If you do not have this it can be obtained through the Library Archives by filling out an application. Website is: https://library-archives.canada.ca>services. In the search section type military records and choose time frame for the veteran. Or call 1-866-578-7777 and they will explain the process. A photocopy of proof of service must be attached to the application (i.e. copy of service id card, discharge papers, etc).
- 3. Candidates must be registered for or enrolled in a full time Program at a Registered Canadian Community College or University.
- 4.Confirmation of enrollment at a Post Secondary Education Institute is required. (i.e. paid enrollment receipt indicating you are registered in a <u>full time program</u>). A photocopy of this must be attached to the application.
- 5. Student can be enrolled in any year of a program.
- 6.Must be a member or related to a member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 255, Windsor, Ontario (signature of the member verifying relationship is required on the last page of the application).

**NOTE**: The decision of the Bursary Committee and acceptance of the Poppy Committee is final.

Successful candidates will be notified by e-mail, mail or phone Please Print Clearly on the Application. This is a one-time only Bursary.

Proof of full time registration for the semester you are registered in is required and also proof of the veterans service id number. Photocopies of these must be attached to the application. Also if the application is not completed in full and if your printing is not legible your application may not be considered.

The Support Committee is planning an Almond Chocolate Fundraiser in the Fall.


To date we have 68 Cadets registered.


