Current Poppy Bank Balance is \$65,129.09

Since Jan. 1 we have made \$27,534.17 of donations from the Poppy Trust Fund. These donations include the 2 big ones to our Cadet Corps and Parkwood Hospital to renovate Veterans Rooms with new beds etc. We have given out 2 bursaries to date and purchased \$50 Food Gift Cards to up our emergency Veteran food cards to \$150.00. Our service officer administers these cards on an emergency/need basis and so far it is going well.

We received a \$1000.00 donation from Comrade Don Bennett. Don held a fundraiser on June 22<sup>nd</sup> entitled "Singing for Vets and Pets". The Windsor/Essex Humane Society also received a \$1000.00 donation. Thank you Don and his team.

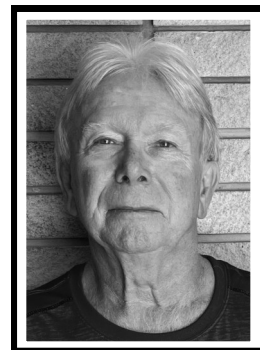
## **MEMBERSHIP REPORT - Ken Marshall / Chair**

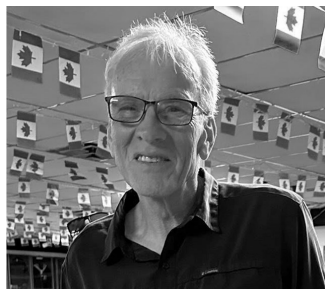

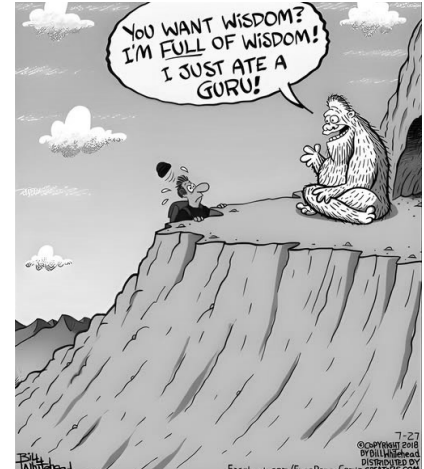
