POPPY REPORT - Ron Marshall

Current Poppy Bank Balance is \$68,496.86

The Poppy: The Poppy has been a symbol of Remembrance throughout the World for over 100 years. In Canada, the red poppy is a powerful symbol of remembrance for all who served and sacrificed in the nation's military, particularly those who died in war. Inspired by John McCrae's poem "In Flanders Fields" the poppy came to symbolize the flowers that grew on battle-scarred fields during World War 1. (Lieutenant-Colonel John McCrae was a Canadian poet, physician and soldier during World War 1.)

Today, the Royal Canadian Legion distributes poppies for the annual Poppy Campaign to raise funds to assist veterans and their families as well as providing funds for medical research and organizations that provide programs that help veterans with PTSD and other issues.

This year's Poppy Campaign commences on Friday, October 31st and ends on November 11th. Volunteer Boards will go up on Friday October 17th and will be located on the North Wall, near the front entrance.

This year's campaign runs for only 11 days, so it would be nice to fill all of our 2 hour Volunteer slots. Raising funds to assist our Veterans and their families is the most important thing we do as a Legion. Please consider Volunteering your time this year.

At our museum, every day is a tribute to veterans and the legacy of history. We invite you to come explore and remember with us.






