The RCL #255 Veteran Banner Program will start up in April. Applications will be available at the Branch (Table by the front door) on Saturday April 4th . Cost of a 2026 Banner has yet to be determined but the cost for 2025 was \$190.00 to give an idea.

On Saturday April 18th, from 1-3pm at Branch #255, we will be accepting banners from those who had a new banner in 2025. The cost for 2026 will be \$40.00 (cash only please). You only need to bring your banner; we already have your paperwork. Only those who had their banners up in the first year of 2025 are eligible. If you had a banner up in 2025 for the second year you will need to order a new banner for 2026. This is due to the banner manufacturer warranty and that after 2 years, we want banner sponsors to have a banner that is not battered by the weather elements.

On Saturday April 25th from 1-3pm at Branch #255 we will be accepting new applications for the banner program. You need to bring in the application form, fee (cash only please) and a picture of the veteran. If you have a scanned picture that is great, but we can also scan any picture (8.5 X11 and smaller) on the day of bringing in the application. It will be first come, first served, and we cannot guarantee that your application will be accepted. We have 50 slots and part of those will be filled but the first-year banners from 2025.

Fundraisers:

Pasta fundraiser – Due to unforeseen circumstances, the February 9th, 2026 fundraiser was Cancelled for now.

Cadets:

Field Training Exercise (FTX) - There will be a joint (2828 Cadet Corps & 202 Cadet Corps) weekend Field Training Exercise at a location and date yet to be determined.

Monthly Training Schedule - Cadets, ranging in age from 12 – 18 yrs of age, train and have classroom studies every Monday of the week from September to end-June. All new recruits begin in the Green Star training program and then proceed to Red, Silver, Gold, and finally Master Cadet. Each program requires different levels of skills, proficiency, and self-discipline to be mastered.

The Advanced Leadership Program - (ALP) Notices to Senior cadets have been emailed for all concerned for registration purposes. These are mandatory courses to complete the program level training.

Marksmanship - The Corps participated in the competition held at the Armouries on Feb. 7th. It was well attended and although they didn't place top two, they enjoyed the experience and are looking forward to trying out for next year's team. The corps will start to have shooting days on Saturdays to allow the cadets to come out and practice if they want to (not mandatory) but will be open to all cadets.

Summer Camps – Cadets interested in applying for 2026 Summer Training are asked to go to the DND summer training website for courses that they are eligible to apply for. Cadets must be a Red Star cadet or higher to apply.

Recruiting – The unit currently has 82 cadets on strength (only 50% attending). The Support Committee continues to ask the parents to become involved in supporting the unit on the Support Committee.

Our Support Committee meeting was held on Monday, February 23rd, 2026 at the Armouries. Meetings are held every last Monday of the month.

VETERANS

Starting January 1st, 2026, veterans and members of the Canadian Armed Forces can ride for free on UP Express when travelling with their Veteran's Service Card or a Canadian Military Service ID. This includes regular and reserve force members.

How to take advantage of the new fare type Starting January 1, you just need to make sure you have your Veteran's Service Card or a Canadian Military Service ID whenever you are travelling on UP Express to qualify for free travel.

If you are carrying your valid ID after January 1, there is no need to tap your PRESTO card. If you do, you will be charged a standard fare. Accepted National Defense Identification (NDI) cards include:

- Valid permanent Canadian Forces Identification Card - NDI 20
- Canadian Armed Forces Veteran Service Card - NDI 75
- Temporary National Defense Identification Card - NDI 10

Veterans who do not have a Veteran's Service Card can apply for one through VETRANS AFFAIRS.


BINGO REPORT
