# **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

## ***BRUCE TRIBUTE***

April 11th-12th, I attended the District A Spring Convention in Chatham Ontario with Comrade Dennis Holmes. Many useful topics were discussed. There were 112 Legion members present, including 13 members from Zone A-1.

Some information was shared pertaining to the Poppy Fund. Comrade Dennis brought up the issue of the \$13 Million sitting in the Provincial Poppy Fund. Why is this just sitting when it is meant for Veterans' causes. This point was discussed at length and it was stated that that number had been decreased since the last convention. Keep up the good work, Comrades.

Until now, donations to the Service Dog program required an SUF (Special Use Form). Soon, that requirement will be removed, allowing more funds to be directed to this program. Another flaw in the Service Dog Program was brought up as well. One member in attendance was told when applying for a dog for a Veteran member, that it could not happen as Southwestern Ontario is too far away from where the dogs are trained. If this is the case, why do we donate thousands of dollars annually but are not able to access the program based on our distance from the Wounded Warriors Training Centre? Changes are pending.

\$5000 to Homeless Veterans

\$2000 to the Charitable Foundation

\$2000 to Bursaries

**Monthly Training Schedule** - Cadets, ranging in age from 12 – 18 yrs of age, train and have classroom studies every Monday of the week from September to end-June.

**Mass Casualty Exercise** - On **Saturday & Sunday, April 25/26th** – The senior Silver star cadets have been invited to participate in a cross-border Mass casualty exercise with HMCS Hunter, Windsor Police, EMS, Fire, LaSalle Fire and Police, as well as CBSA. This unique opportunity for all the cadets involved will take place on the Detroit River simulating a medical emergency that happens onboard a ship where they need to mass transport 100 casualties from one vessel to another and transport them to a triage area.

**Change of Command** - On **Saturday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> at 11:00am** the Windsor Regiment “**Change of Command**” ceremonies will be held at the Armouries.

**Annual Inspection Day** - On **Monday June 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:30pm**, the cadets will participate in their year-end Annual Inspection at the Armouries. Awards will be given out and refreshments will follow the closing ceremonies.

**Year-End Trip (YET)** – On **Saturday, June 6th, 2026** the cadets will be taken to **Canada's Wonderland Park** in Vaughan, ON by bus for an all-day excursion for their year-end trip. Cadets must bring \$10.00 to reserve their seat on the bus by May 25th. These funds will be returned to them upon departure. The Support Committee negotiated a food package at the Park that allows cadets to free food & drinks all day.

**Summer Camps** – The applications of all cadets who expressed interest in going to summer camp have now been sent in and awaiting to hear of their acceptance.

**Recruiting** – The unit currently now has 75 cadets on strength with approximately 50% in weekly attendance. We continue to ask the parents to become involved in their children's activities while supporting the unit on the Support Committee.

# VETERANS

Starting January 1st, 2026, veterans and members of the Canadian Armed Forces can ride for free on UP Express when travelling with their Veteran's Service Card or a Canadian Military Service ID. This includes regular and reserve force members.

**How to take advantage of the new fare type Starting January 1**, you just need to make sure you have your Veteran's Service Card or a Canadian Military Service ID whenever you are travelling on UP Express to qualify for free travel.

If you are carrying your valid ID after January 1, there is no need to tap your PRESTO card. If you do, you will be charged a standard fare. Accepted National Defense Identification (NDI) cards include:

- Valid permanent Canadian Forces Identification Card - NDI 20
- Canadian Armed Forces Veteran Service Card - NDI 75
- Temporary National Defense Identification Card - NDI 10

Veterans who do not have a Veteran's Service Card can apply for one through VETRANS AFFAIRS.

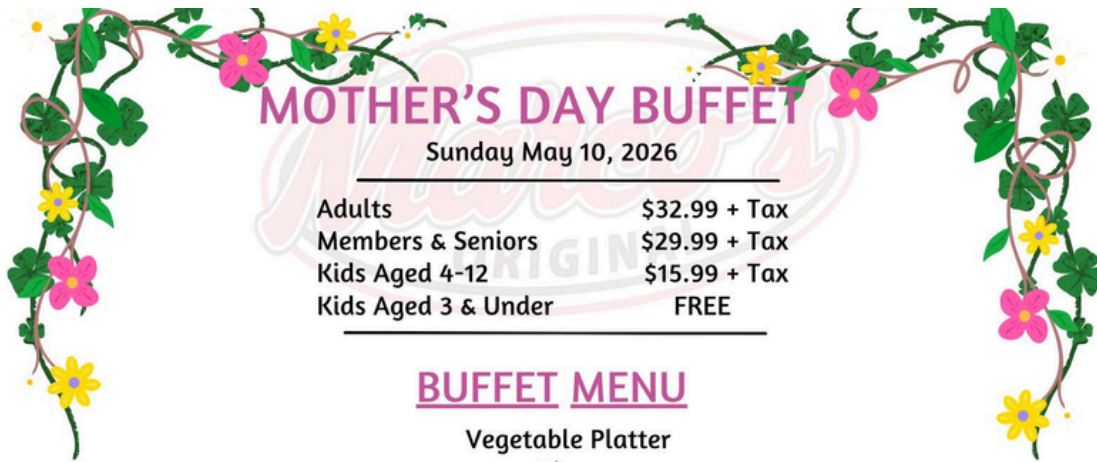
