

A Place of Hospitality

"Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers" (Heb. 13:2)

Now, more than ever, our community needs for Union to be a place of hospitality. We have a lot to offer as a congregation: inspired worship, excellent Bible study and small groups, service and mission opportunities on many fronts, fantastic children, youth and family programs, and the list goes on. But none of that matters if we don't first create a welcoming environment where people quickly learn that they matter to us, and to God.

My article here doesn't allow room to give a Biblical review of hospitality, but students of the Bible know that hospitality permeates the culture of the Old Testament and of the early church. Hospitality is encouraged and even commanded. It expresses the nature of God in Christ Jesus.

Showing hospitality is one way to get your "spiritual assist" this year (cf. my January article!). It's important to be friendly and to be a friendly church. But friendliness is not the same as hospitality. You can be friendly and still not show hospitality.



To create a place of hospitality, we have to take the initiative to go beyond being kind and friendly. You do that something more that demonstrates you truly see and welcome the other person and want to help them engage. It's an act of identifying their need and adjusting your time and effort to assist them.

A room-service waiter at a Marriott hotel learned that the sister of a guest had just died. The waiter, named Charles, bought a sympathy card, had hotel staff members sign it, and gave it to the distraught guest with a piece of hot apple pie. "Mr. Marriott," the guest later wrote to the president of Marriott Hotels, "I'll never meet you. And I don't need to meet you. Because I met Charles, I know what you stand for. ... I want to assure you that as long as I live, I will stay at your hotels. And I will tell others to stay at your hotels." (from the book, *Turned On*, by Roger Dow and Susan Cook, Harper Business, 1996)

Hospitality in the church is getting out of yourself, so you can represent Christ. Like Paul wrote to the Philippians, "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus."

I think we would want those who come to our church to be able to say, "because I met the people of Union, I know what Christ meant when he said, "Love one another as I have loved you." Let us keep making this place a place of hospitality, for every person God sends our way.


