

Well Done, Good and Faithful Servants

At the end of this past month, Cynthia and I celebrated 46 years of marriage. Yes, I robbed the cradle, I know. We were 21 and 20 and both of us were still in college, living off dreams and hopes and very little money. I dropped out of school to work until she graduated; then she began her nursing career while I completed my degree.

Cynthia's parents had budgeted to give her fifty dollars a month for incidentals while she was in college. They graciously continued that even after we married. In fact, that gift basically paid our married student housing rent at Clemson (\$72/month!!). Even for the seventies, those post-World War II metal houses were a deal!

I learned something about generosity and faithfulness from her parents. They had other children in school and at home, but their giving was reliable and made a real difference for us. It taught us about giving, about making a plan and sticking to it, and finding joy in making a difference for others.

Who taught you about giving? Where did you learn to be a faithful giver, or a "cheerful" giver, as the Apostle Paul puts it? I know you've heard sermons about giving because I've preached a few. But people don't learn so much from a message as they do from example. Did someone else's generosity teach and inspire you?

While serving Christ with generosity certainly has to do with our financial gifts, it obviously is much more than that. We give our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness, just like we pledge when we join the church. Union UMC is a very active church, but it offers so many ministries only because our people give of their time and talents. Union impacts hundreds of lives each week, and that's possible because the giving of our people is reliable. Well done, good and faithful servants! (Matt. 25:23)

Let's keep it that way, especially during these summer months! Usually there is a drop-off in giving as people are often away in the summer. And the truth is, we'll tend to spend extra on our vacations, trips and entertainments while neglecting to support our ministries as we should.

So, let's resolve this summer to be cheerful givers – with deep appreciation for all God has given us, and gratitude for the opportunity to be useful in God's work. And, let's be reliable givers – keeping our church strong in its mission and witness. Finally, just like my in-laws did more than expected, I'm going to ask you to do something more. Our Building Fund pledge cycle ends this month, but we won't have another pledge cycle until our combined Annual Budget Fund and Building Fund pledge in October. Yet our mortgage payments will continue monthly. *Can you continue to give to the Building Fund at your present level of giving?*


Union Basketball is introducing Clinics this summer to help work on and grow skills of the game!




