The First Commandment

Well, I suppose you could argue that it isn't really a commandment, but the truth is, anyone who wants to know the abundant life has to treat it like a commandment. By that I mean, they have to understand that it requires commitment, devotion, or as Mary Oliver wrote, "loyalty like the kind water has to gravity."

I'll concede a bit and call it an "Invitation," because it definitely is that as well. It's an open-ended invitation to anyone anywhere – no matter who they are or where they've been, no matter what they've done, or left undone. But don't assume that as an invitation, it's simply an offer. Nope, this one demands a decision, an R.S.V.P.

It was stated by Jesus himself, and it is Jesus to whom the response has to be made. He said to the first disciples, as he says to any disciple: "Come, follow me."

That is the first thing, and the main thing Jesus asks of us – follow him, stay near to him, walk with him, listen to him, talk with him, - just be with him. Following Jesus means we have to adjust our pace to his, and more significantly, we have to go where he goes.

That's not easy for us who have been raised in a culture of "make your own choices." We're not used to submitting our opinions, our decisions, our reactions, or our judgments to anyone else. So when Jesus says, "Come, follow me," we typically pull back, and think, "I'll follow, but at a distance."

Amazingly, a lot of Christians expect to spend eternity with Jesus, but don't make the effort to spend much time with him here and now, other than showing up at church once a week. That's like a young man proposing marriage to a young lady, and saying, "I love you and want to spend eternity with you, but until then I'll just check in once a week."

We have so much to learn. And so much awaiting us. And we can't absorb it all at once. Thankfully, Jesus is patient and forgiving, and is always ready to welcome us to come alongside him and his motley crew of followers.

You already know the commandments that Jesus said are the most important: Love the Lord your God with everything you are and have, and love your neighbor as yourself. It's kind of hard to do either of those if you don't begin with his first commandment – Come, follow me. It's a gift, a daily commitment, a transforming walk of life. -SPT

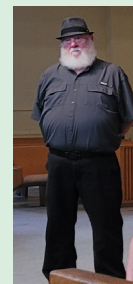

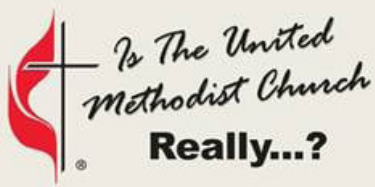


Bunco Night with the United Women in Faith

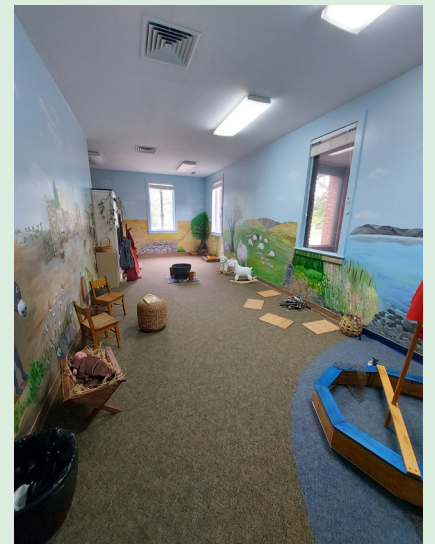

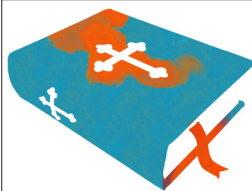

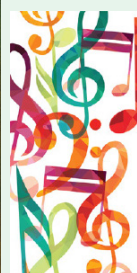

The Fourteenth Annual Sharing God's Love Benefit Golf Tournament

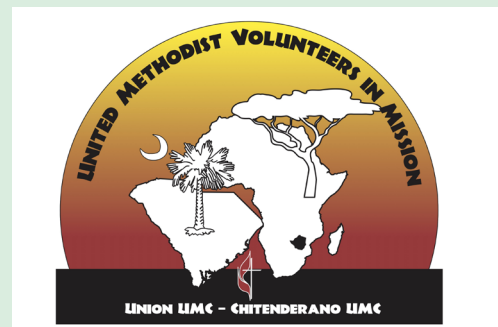
Love to golf?

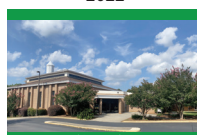
