

People of the Moistened Stone

There's a story about Ba'al Shem Tov, founder of the Hasidic tradition of Judaism: "After the death of Ba'al Shem Tov, his work was taken up by his disciples. Each young rabbi would travel to the villages, telling stories of their master, reminding the people of his teachings and carrying out various duties, such as the slaying of the animals to provide kosher meat.

Whenever one of the rabbi came to a village, he would repeat the stories, say the prayers, follow the rituals, and kill the animals. Each time he noticed a man standing at the back of the crowd who would simply shake his head. At first he dismissed him as a Gentile who rejected the ways of Israel. Then he learned that the man was in fact, a leader of the synagogue and perhaps the most devout Jew in town.

When he could stand it no longer, the rabbi spoke to the man, demanding, "Why do you shake your head? Have I not said the prayers? Have I not sharpened the knife on the whetstone to the highest keenness to reduce as much as possible the pain of the animals? What then is lacking?" The old man replied, "When the Ba'al Shem Tov would sharpen the knife, he moistened the stone with his tears, knowing the sacrifice that would be made."

This story is from a book called *Faith-full Stories: The Narrative Road to Religion*, (Edited by John C. Hoffman). It challenges us to think whether our actions involve our hearts. Is there compassion for others in what we do, or simply a desire to get the job done?

None of us will be slaying animals for kosher meat this week, but we will probably be around people who are struggling, who may be experiencing pain or loss in their lives. It's just too easy to say, "I'll pray for you," and indeed to offer a prayer, without ever letting their life and struggle touch our hearts. Do tears ever moisten our prayers?

With social media feeds and news networks continuously assaulting our senses, it is difficult to listen well to others and to connect on a heart level. Our challenge is to not let the many demands of our day disconnect us from our hearts. To allow yourself to feel the sacrifices made by others or the sufferings they endure is a sign of strength, not weakness. Keeping a sensitive heart requires a mature faith.

When praying for our troops, do we consider the sacrifices they and their families are making? When praying for those who do not follow Jesus, do we consider the eventual futility of their lives and the fate of an eternity without Christ? When you pray a blessing for a meal, do you think of those who go to bed hungry? When we pray for ourselves, is there an honest recognition of the tremendous price paid for our sins?

It is good to do what we know to do and to do it well. But on another level, people of the moistened stone experience the presence of God. For when our hearts are in it, we touch the heart of God. Instead of becoming numbed by the turmoils of our times, let us focus on living and serving together in Christ's love, as people of the moistened stone.



While there, we will eat, fellowship, and play games with those in attendance and just share the love of Jesus through some good time spent together.






