

Thy Kingdom Come

Every Sunday, when the congregation joins together to say the Lord's Prayer, we pray for God's Kingdom to come to pass. "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done," we pray. This is a prayer that the rule of God will replace the rule of men and women. It should be our most fervent prayer.

Looking at our world, it doesn't take long to see that the rule of humankind is seriously flawed. It doesn't matter your political slant, we know there's always a big difference between what's promised in an election and what actually comes to pass. We make saints out of some and devils out of others, but the truth is "there is no one righteous, no, not one." And we ourselves are implicated when instead of praying for God's wisdom to guide our leaders, we judge and gossip and even slander them—things I'm pretty sure the Bible tells us not to do.

The failure of the kingdoms of this world is not just expressed in politics, nor is it only in obvious places of conflict and war. We see and feel the effects in broken homes, addictive lifestyles, unethical business practices, bureaucratic inflexibility, systemic prejudice and racism, and just plain old greed and meanness. We all know there is injustice in our world, and secretly most of us just hope to be on the side that benefits from it.

A friend of mine told me about his father's "ancient" truck. Once it was a "pick-up" truck but now it's a "patched-up" truck. The odometer broke a few years ago, after recording over 200 thousand miles. But his dad keeps tinkering with it. After a new bellowing of smoke from the exhaust, his dad reluctantly took it to his mechanic and asked, "What needs to be fixed now?" The mechanic took a quick look and told him, "Nothing. You need to stop patching this thing and get a new truck."

We are a lot like that truck owner. We've patched and tinkered with our lives, all the while thinking one day we'll get it right. We come to church looking for the scripture or the idea that explains things for us, or inspires us to get through another week. We want enough of God to get us through the immediate difficulty, but not so much that we have to make real changes in our lives. We tell ourselves that we can fix what's wrong, or at least manage it. But we resist, however, turning it all over to God. And yet we pray, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done."

I believe that the prayer for God's rule in our lives is the central prayer of the church. Seeking God's kingdom is the one prayer that can shatter our complacency and lead us to the life called abundant. Let's keep praying it together at church, until Jesus' prayer becomes the prayer of our lives. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Amen.

Praying for General Conference

The United Methodist Church General Conference is meeting April 23-May 3 in Charlotte, NC.

General Conference is the denomination's highest legislative body, and will be making many decisions in the

eleven days they are meeting. While General Conference typically gathers every four years, due to the pandemic, this will be the first time they've met since May 2016.

During these 11 days, we invite you to join us in praying for the many aspects of General Conference. There are several ways you can participate.

Pick up a prayer booklet, which focuses on a different aspect of General Conference for each of the 11 days. These booklets will be ready for you to pick up in the narthex starting Sunday, April 14.

- Set aside a particular time each day to read and pray for General Conference.
- You can join us in praying the clock where day 1 will start at 8 a.m., day 2 would be 9 a.m. and so on so by the end of the 11 days, we have covered 8 a.m.- 7 p.m. in prayer.

Sign up for a prayer vigil time slot. General Conference meets for 11 days from 9 a.m.- 1 p.m. each day. We will have a sign-up board in the narthex starting Sunday, April 14, where you can sign up and commit to praying for General

Conference during a specified time. There are 44 time slots and more than one person can sign up for a time slot.


- Set aside time to be at Union in prayer for General Conference. We will set aside space in the library, LL 13, for prayer.




Union's Endowment Fund




