

The Big G

The other day I was simply a grump, and I'm willing to admit it. My wife, Cynthia, would probably ask, "What's unusual about that?" Wives have a constitutional right, I think, to make such remarks. But you know how it is when you're grumpy. You feel "put out" when things don't go just like you expect, when you're delayed a bit in your schedule, or when you're asked to do more than you think you should have to do. So, in response to such "grave and note worthy injustices" you become irritable and hard to get along with.



Grumpiness is a sly and persistent creature that will wait until you're tired, frustrated, or overwhelmed. Then it will quickly wrap you up in a deadlock before you know it. It's hard to break out of the Big G's hold on you and show patience and kindness. It usually takes outside intervention – like someone else being gracious to you for no reason at all, or God reminding you that you really aren't the Big Stuff you're starting to think you are, or, your wife's elbow jabbing you in the ribs.

Me? I rushed by the grocery store to buy a particular clothes detergent we use (for sensitive skin, ironically). It was half-price, and I was ready to load up. But the shelf was empty, and the stock boy said there wasn't any more in the store. I was "put out" and unfortunately grumpiness characterized my behavior to the hard-working stock boy and the checkout clerk. So much for my Christian witness that day! I'm just glad I wasn't wearing my shirt with the Union logo on it!

The truth is, it's just as easy for Christians to carry the Big G around as it is for anyone else. We can get "put out" when things aren't just like we expect them to be at church. Who knows how many church spats or damaged relationships have occurred because someone said something out of grumpiness instead of grace? Who knows the number of people who would make great leaders for ministries but refuse because they fear the people who have the Big G sitting on their shoulders.

But thanks be to God in that however much the chance exists for grumpiness to abound, the grace of God abounds even more! I see people repeatedly getting their "grumpiness guards" as they participate in worship, submit to God in prayer, study the scriptures, or work together in service to Christ. And the more we do these things, the more patient we'll be, and encouraging we'll be, when things aren't "just right." Others can then know us for the grace we show as we let God's Spirit guide us – and that's a lot better than an elbow to the ribs!

Martha Circle is a group of ladies of all ages that meet once a month from September to May. Our time together is spent in fellowship, supporting each other and growing in our relationship with God. We are currently studying Jennie Allen's book "Find Your People" and are discovering the importance of consistent, meaningful connections. We also host an annual "IF" women's weekend, featuring speakers from Jennie Allen's annual conference.

Our Circle's namesake comes from two very important ladies – Martha in the Bible, who was a significant New Testament figure, a personal friend of Jesus, and someone with whom many women today identify – and also Martha Thompson, the former Director of the Union UMC Preschool. From both of these amazing ladies, we learn the importance of balancing service with worship, of trusting the Lord even when all seems lost, and of using our resources for the glory of God.

Martha Circle's sole mission is to support the Lexington-Richland School District 5 Snack Pack Program. Our designated school is Harbison West in Irmo and we currently support 117 students at this elementary school. The Snack Pack Program provides nutritious food to students who do not have enough to eat throughout the weekend. The hope is to fill a hungry belly so that children are able to focus and be ready to learn on Monday morning.




