

Who Has The Remote?

At a wedding reception the father of the bride made the first toast of the evening, and it was the only one I remembered. Well, I don't remember all of it, just his conclusion, which was some advice for the couple. "Remember," he said, looking primarily at his daughter, "you've got to learn to share the (TV) remote control."

We all laughed of course, but you could tell he didn't say it just for a joke. It was his way of reminding his daughter and new son-in-law that you can't assume to have things your own way, and that there are many times you have to hand control over to your spouse. It was good advice, not just for that couple, but for all of us.

I thought his imagery was insightful. Many times, it is in the little things (like sharing a remote control) where the big problems begin to show up. The respect we feel toward others becomes evident not in our public displays, but in the small acts, often overlooked by others. Are we willing to let others have choices, or do we have to have things "our way?" Are we willing to deny ourselves or be inconvenienced for the sake of someone else?

Someone once said: I don't worry about the parts of the Bible I don't understand, I have enough trouble with the parts I do understand. That being the case, we might wish the following passage from Philippians wasn't so clear and understandable. "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus." (Phil 2)

That passage presents us with a big challenge, especially in the contentious, ever-changing world in which we live. Today, people are often applauded for taking offense at what others say or who they are. Today, we are regularly told to look out for ourselves, or to "get ours," rather than to look "to the interests of others." Following the parts of scripture that are easily understood may require a counter-cultural effort.

Even in the church, there are times when we each will be inconvenienced – times when we are expected to "watch the program someone else chose," so to speak. Some people won't like this and will move on to other places or become inactive. But I think most of us realize that sharing the remote is part of what it takes to live together as the body of Christ.

"You have to learn to share the remote control," the bride's father said. It's a great reminder not just for watching TV but for living. And with football season approaching, it's a reminder I need. But then, don't we all?

We have all experienced increased costs, especially in the last 2 years.

This is why the Endowment Committee takes inflation seriously and includes it in our calculations for disbursement. We want to make sure the contributions you make today can support the same facility projects, outreach and missions of the Church 40 years from now and beyond.

(For Example: Since 2019, the fund has received \$164,358 in gifts. Adjusting the gifts for inflation, our Corpus is \$192,572. We will not distribute any funds that will take the balance below the Corpus.) This allows the Legacy Gift to be permanent and maintain its purchasing power.






Parent and Kid's Library


Another Big Trustee Thank You!


