

#### Rev. Taylor's "State of the Church" Report to the 2024 Charge Conference

Union UMC is a growing, multi-celled servant church that is actively living out its mission to Know Christ, Share Faith and Show Grace. It is blessed with strong lay leadership and a congregation committed to servanthood, inclusion and diversity. We strive to be a safe place where all persons can grow in their discipleship to Jesus Christ. Our people put their faith into action again and again through their hospitality, service and outreach.

I wish to highlight two changes that are not limited to the calendar year, processes that began over the last couple of years and will continue, I believe, into the near future. They deal with leadership and identity.

Many of the strong ministries of Union, such as The Living Christmas Story, the UWF, Youth Counselors, along with various ministry teams, for example, have been undergoing a subtle but significant shift in generational leadership. New leaders are being mentored to ensure the continuation of classes, ministries, circles and small groups.

This process has required trust, or better, faith, as experienced leaders have had to make room for new leaders to bring new ideas to established traditions. This is a challenging evolution in a church's growth, and also is a sign of a healthy church.

Secondly, there is a growing awareness, mainly among the lay leadership but also throughout the congregation, of Union's distinct identity among the churches of our area. This is primarily a result of our public stance as a United Methodist church of inclusion. Our people inhabit the same cultural space as those in former UMC churches in Chapin and Lexington, as well as those in influential Baptist churches nearby. Our members encounter the false assumption that Union has "forsaken the Bible" since we do not interpret the scriptures in a fundamentalist fashion.

In some cases, this has caused hard feelings and even animosity from friends and extended family members in these other churches. We are learning how to claim our Wesleyan heritage with confidence, forsaking the need to push back or become defensive. Dealing with this criticism from others has become a real testing ground for us to grow in fulfilling Jesus' command to "love one another even as I have loved you."

Thankfully, Union has had a strong Bible study component for years. A significant portion of the congregation knows that a literal interpretation of scriptures is inadequate. We still have a lot to learn as we base our actions and our application of scripture on the life and teachings of Jesus, but I believe there is a growing confidence in our being distinctive in our centralist identity.

Finally, I wish to commend the talented and dedicated administrative and ministry staff of Union. We are blessed to have a team that works together well, laughs together, and prays together as it serves the body of Christ. Without hesitation, Union's employees go the extra mile in helping the church engage new people and fulfill its mission.

With all that our congregation has faced over the past couple of years – post Covid, post General Conference, and post general separation anxiety – we have a team planning for 2025 to be a <u>Year of Healing and Hope</u>. Worship and mission opportunities will be based on Jesus' announcement of his mission found in Luke chapter 4: *to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.* 

We anticipate continuing in our growth - in membership, in diversity, in our calling and identity, in our mental wellness, and in our discipleship. The journey is not without difficulties and sacrifices, but the impact of changed lives, the realization of faith and hope, and the companionship of the Spirit gives abiding joy. Thanks be to God!

# **Endowment Fun Facts**

INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT CHARITABLE GIVING:

- The average charitable donor in the U.S. is 64 years old making two charitable donations a year.
- Foundation giving in 2023 increased to \$103.53 billion—a 1.7% increase from 2022.<sup>1</sup>
- Giving by bequest in 2023 was \$42.68 billion—a 8.0% increase from 2022.<sup>1</sup>
- In 2023, the majority of charitable dollars went to religion (24%), human services (14%), education (14%), grantmaking foundations (13%) and public-society benefit (10%).

• The United Nations estimates that approximately \$2.7 trillion is donated to charitable causes globally each year. WHY DO WE GIVE:

- When you give to others, your body releases endorphins that can lift your spirits.
- Generous people feel better about themselves. Studies have even linked generosity to improved physical health.
- It can decrease blood pressure and cortisol, a hormone directly correlated with stress levels. People who give of themselves in a balanced way also tend to be healthier and live longer.

Giving and\or leaving a donation to a cause you support makes you feel better. Charitable donations to such causes as the Union Endowment will allow your money to support the Church for many generations to come as the principal is not spent and only earnings are used to support the missions and outreach.






