When Union's *The Living Christmas Story* takes place, can Christmas itself be far behind? When I was a boy, the arrival of the Christmas season was signaled by the arrival of the Sears & Roebuck Christmas Catalogue. We siblings tussled over who got to go through it first. Rarely did any of us get the things we circled, but we spent considerable time dreaming and debating the merits of our selections. And considering the number of specialty catalogues that come to our house, purchase-dreaming is still a profitable enterprise.

That wasn't such a bad thing, to sit with a catalogue full of possibilities for dreams and hopes. You really don't even need the catalogue. Think of a young couple dreaming and hoping as a child grows in the womb. Think of semesters of study as the student dreams and hopes for their future. After a life-changing event, think of the necessary time of dreaming and hoping as a person carefully begins afresh.

Israel dreamed and hoped that one day an ancient promise would be fulfilled: for a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and you shall call him Immanuel (meaning "God is with us."), vs 7. What a powerful dream, that the very God who created all things intends to be with us. What a powerful hope, that in all situations we can meet the incarnate Word, Jesus, who has told us to abide in him as he abides in us. These are hopes and dreams that pack a punch: that make a way where there seems to be no way and that give us peace and joy in the journey.

Here at Union, we've had some people who have spent time dreaming and hoping for the coming year. Plans are in place for us to observe 2025 as <u>A Year of Healing and Hope</u> – a time to focus on God's Spirit bringing release from the past, giving us sight for the future, and providing what we need for personal and communal wholeness.

While the church will provide special opportunities and worship experiences for us to engage this theme, I strongly encourage you to do your own dreaming and hoping. What does God have next for you? Will 2025 be more of the old same old, or will your walk with Christ take you to new places of spiritual health and service? What do Healing and Hope look like for you?

<u>A Personal Note:</u> I will miss being with you at Christmas this year. The week before Christmas I will have some hand surgery and will be recovering through the New Year. I covet your prayers for all that to go well. I myself pray that you experience a blessed Christmas. May the Spirit of Christ our Lord fill you and bring you peace.



Important 2024 Year End Giving Reminders

- All contributions for 2024 must be received by <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>December 31</u> to be recorded on your 2024 giving statement. If you are mailing a year-end contribution, please be sure to mail it in time that we receive it prior to December 31st. Any contributions received after December 31, will be included on your 2025 giving statement.
- If you are considering a stock gift for 2024, please consider starting the process now. It can take a week or more for these transactions to be processed by the brokerages. If you are making a stock gift, please make sure you use our correct account at Fidelity to receive the gift. Laura in the finance office can provide this information to you. Also, please let Laura know that a gift is being sent so that we can be sure to credit it to the correct donor.
- If your address has changed during 2024, please make sure the church has your correct address as we prepare to mail your year-end giving statements.
- All expense reimbursements that relate to 2024 should be turned into the church office by December 31st.
 Any reimbursements requests related to 2024 received after December 31st may be applied to the 2025 budget rather than the 2024 budget.

United Women in Faith Spotlight: Sarah Circle

The Sarah Circle meets on the third Tuesday of the month (except for the summer months) at 12:15pm in the Fellowship Hall on the first floor under the sanctuary. Two circle members take turns providing lunch each month, and the business meeting and program follow our meal. Our programs are usually led by circle members and are often either a Bible study series or special one-time topics led by one of our members or an outside speaker. 
Endowment Fun Facts

'TIS THE SEASON:

For nonprofit organizations, it is. Below are 5 facts\statistics of charitable contributions:

- Many organizations raise 17-31% of their online revenue in December.
- Most nonprofits bring in 47% of their online revenue in the last week of December.
- This explains why 46.2% of nonprofits start their end-of-year marketing in November.
- 97% of donors state it's the impact of their gift as the reason for giving. (not the tax deduction)
- Only 56% of donors see tax deductions as a motivator.

These donations come as a one-time gift as generosity increases during the Holiday Season. Most are by repeat donors as they are seeing a drop in new donors. Where most nonprofit organizations use these donations to cover their budget, some programs, like the Union Endowment, do not. The Union Endowment was set up to support facilities projects, outreach and missions of Union United Methodist Church outside the scope of the annual budget. In addition, donations to the Union Endowment supports the Church for many generations as the principal is not spent and only earnings are used for this support.




