

Do You Want To Be Healed?

Jesus and some of his followers walked into the large double pools just north of the temple where large crowds gathered. Many of the people were there to wash or collect water, but the majority



were there because they were sick. Under the porticos was a good place to hang out and beg, but there was also a legend that every now and then an angel would stir the waters and the first one into the pool was healed. Picturing the mad scramble to get into the water, it kind of sounds like a tragic pool game, doesn't it?

There was a beggar there who for 38 years couldn't walk. Jesus walked up to him and asked, "Do you want to be healed?" The man began to offer excuses, but that wasn't what Jesus was asking about. Jesus could make the man well, but he was not going to force healing and change on the lame man. He first wanted to know if the man <u>wanted</u> to be made whole.

That's a question each of us must consider. Without a doubt each of us needs the healing presence and power of Christ in our lives. Our needs may be physical, mental, relational or spiritual. But Christ will not force us to take the path to forgiveness, healing and wholeness.

That path brings changes. We may have to let go of some behaviors and attitudes. We may need to adopt new practices. Like the lame man, we may need to put our faith in Christ and figuratively roll up our old mat and walk into a new future.

As Union spends this year claiming the Year of the Lord's Favor, you will have opportunity to participate in several events designed to help us live into the mission Jesus proclaimed - to bring hope to the poor, sight to the blind, and release to the captives (Luke 4).

We hope you will join in the spiritual formation groups, Bible studies, healing services, community meals, and outreach and mission events. But first, deal honestly with yourself: *Do you want to live into the hope and healing that Christ offers?* Stand up, roll up your baggage and come with us!


Creating habits of prayer that increase our mental health.

Prayer is a habit that gets less air time in the mental health buzz. One can not deny that prayer provided us with opportunities for mindfulness, long before mindfulness was popular.

At Union, we kicked off our year of hope and healing with a Prayer Walk. The walk was a time to reflect, recenter, and focus on hope for the future. Give Sight with Healing Guatemala

Bethesda Hospital has held several Cataract Camps, where doctors spend a week at the clinic performing as many as 80 cataract surgeries. Such surgeries are far beyond the financial abilities of the majority of people in the area. Healing Guatemala charges each person \$50, and depends on donations to cover the remaining \$250 of the cost of each surgery.

Beginning February 2, members and families can "adopt" a doll figure that represents the person to whom they will give sight. The goal is to raise funds during February and on Transfiguration Sunday, March 2, celebrate God's grace that allows us to directly be a part of Jesus' mission to give sight to the blind.

She went from school teacher to secretary-treasurer of the Independent Order of St. Luke, founder of a newspaper, a bank, and a department store where Black customers were treated with respect. 
