

Living the Life

The March winds bring in the April showers, the old saying goes. And the April showers bring in May flowers. That saying worked for earlier generations who had time to personally notice what was going on in their world, and not simply watch it on a cell phone video while they waited in line somewhere.

In our busy lives, May seems to bring not flowers, but an extra dose of "rush," especially if there are children in the home. There are end of school events, end of spring sports events, end of dance season events, plays, recitals, proms, and graduations! There are church activities, weddings to attend, spring cleaning to get done, yards to attend to, and if it can be fit in, trips to make.

We manage attending to so much in our world that it makes it difficult to actually be at home in our world. This is not a nostalgic idealization of a past without social communications, hectic schedules and endless opportunities for entertainment. At most it's a painful confession of how easy it is to miss the mark – "living the life" while missing out on living fully in life.

I'm not going to tell you to "slow down," basically because such an imperative doesn't work for me either. But I will share a meditation I have added to my morning reflection time. I think it offers a fresh perspective on the living of our lives.

What is wanted is not that we should find ultimate truth, nor that we should become secure, nor that we should have ease, nor that we should be without hurt, but that we should live fully.

Therefore, we should not fear life, nor anything in life; we should not fear death, nor anything in death; we should live our lives in love with life.

It is for us to train our hearts to live in grace, to sacrifice our self-centered desires, to find the peace without want, and when we fail, to begin again each day.*

You may have your summer weeks already planned out (some of you in detail.) Still, I hope there's some room for learning to live in grace, grace for yourself and for others. I hope our hearts and hands will be doing more "letting go" than "grasping more." And I hope that in the midst of the craziness we can live in the peace that comes from the spirit of Christ.

"I have come that you may have life and have it abundantly," Jesus said. (John 10:10 ESV) I don't believe he meant it as a reward at the end of the journey, but as a reality he offers us in every day. And if we mess it up today, well, we'll just begin again tomorrow. Know the love and joy of Christ – Be the love and joy of Christ – Live the life abundant!














Vacation Bible School is coming!


