

#### The Detested Four-Letter Word

I have received training not to say it, but I catch the words coming out of my mouth anyway. I've been taught to be specific when I offer something, but I guess that just takes too much thought. So, although I know better, like you, I just say what we always say, which means saying the detested four-letter word.

You've heard me say it, and I'm confident you've said it too. It happens as we leave someone who's had a loss, or is facing a challenge, and we say, "If you need anything, just let me know."

There, I said it, the word "need." No one I know wants to be in the position of needing anything, nor of having to admit it. In our culture, we value self-sufficiency, and we work hard to reach that status. We admire those who seem to have their needs taken care of. To need makes us feel weak, inferior or inadequate, and we detest it.

That's why we don't ask for help when we need it. That's why people, especially couples, don't go to counseling. It's why older adults, whose abilities begin to decline, live in fear that someone will notice they "need" help. That's why we avoid entering new groups or situations where we don't know what's expected, or needed from us, and thus we might "need" orientation or directions or help.

Now, we don't mind someone else taking care of what we need, we just don't want to admit it. After all, our favorite psalm starts out "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want." Our denial of need diminishes our lives in many ways. It causes us to hide behind masks of independence and causes us to say everything is OK or "Just fine," when in fact things aren't OK or fine.

The road to spiritual wholeness (and to mental health) is one that embraces truthfulness. That means truthfulness with ourselves, with God and with others. It is a mark of maturity to admit we are human and that we are not complete in ourselves alone.

Lest we forget, Jesus repeatedly demonstrated his acknowledgment of need. He needed his heavenly Father: "the Son can do nothing of his own accord, but only what he sees the Father doing (John 5:19). He expressed his need of companionship from his disciples as he prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane. Think about it, the most complete human that ever lived expressed not his self-sufficiency, but his need - of God, and of others.




