The Significance of the Small

May I tell you a Christmas story? Fine, have a seat and indulge me for a few minutes.

In the summer of '61, my family moved from a small rental house into our new brick ranch house on our farm. There was room in the house, and plenty of room on the farm to roam. It would be a couple of years before my parents could afford furniture for the combo living/dining room across the front half of the house. All that was in there was Mom's upright piano, so I thought the open room made a great place to play.

That Christmas my three older siblings picked out a cedar for Dad to cut. They were absorbed with decorating it and the house and getting presents ready. Mom was busy with my baby brother, but I think she perhaps noticed I was getting left out of their merriment. She must have said something to my dad, because he did something quite unexpected. Two evenings before Christmas he took me, and just me, to the Benjamin's Five and Ten store on the square downtown.

My Dad gave me five dollar bills and told me I could shop for presents. That was a lot of money, and he gave me plenty of time to make my selections. Finally, I had my gifts for each of my siblings, and one for my mom. And, I got 43 cents back in change!

The next morning my oldest sister helped me wrap all but hers. She cut the wrapping paper and left me to finish up. I was feeling good as I took my presents and placed them under the tree. Then I saw something that made me feel bad. It was a present under the tree from my sister to our dad. I had forgotten to get Dad a present!

I tried to think of what I could do, but the afternoon was taken up with church and then supper at a relative's home. When I got home, I knew I had to get Dad something. So, I took my change and stacked the coins – the quarter, the nickel, the three pennies and finally the dime – and wrapped them with plain white paper. I wrote "Dad," and "love" and "Stephen" and went and placed it under the tree. I was giving him back his money, but it was all I had.

I was embarrassed the next morning when Dad was handed my gift, the smallest of presents under the tree. I tried to explain what I'd done, but he just smiled and gave me a hug and told me it was a great present and he was pleased.

My Father died in November of 2011. The following January I helped my Mom clean out his home office. In one of the desk drawers was a small box. I opened it, and there was the stack of coins, just like I'd wrapped them fifty Christmases before.

Throughout the rush of December don't overlook the small presents - small kindnesses, small remembrances, small moments of care and love - they might have life-long significance.



- All contributions for 2025 must be received by <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>December 31</u> to be recorded on your 2025 giving statement. If you are mailing a year-end contribution, please be sure to mail it in time that we receive it prior to December 31st. Any contributions received after December 31, will be included on your 2026 giving statement.
- If you are considering a stock gift for 2025, please consider starting the process now. It can take a week or more for these transactions to be processed by the brokerages. If you are making a stock gift, please make sure you use our correct account at Fidelity to receive the gift. Laura in the finance office can provide this information to you. Also, please let Laura know that a gift is being sent so that we can be sure to credit it to the correct donor.
- If your address has changed during 2025, please make sure the church has your correct address as we prepare to mail your year-end giving statements.
- All expense reimbursements that relate to 2025 should be turned into the church office by December 31st.
 Any reimbursements requests related to 2025 received after December 31st may be applied to the 2026 budget rather than the 2025 budget.






