Be Ye Not Offended

I don't know if you make resolutions when the New Year rolls around, but if you do, might I suggest this one: "I resolve not to take offense at what others do or say." It's as good a one to work on as any, and we probably need it more than the standard resolutions to get in good physical shape or to keep in touch with friends.

We live in a time when expressing our "offense" toward others, or because of others, is readily accepted, and sometimes encouraged. And "offenses" are harbored, kept in our hearts, ready to be called upon when we feel slighted or denied something we may feel is our right.

We have a long way to go to put into practice the teachings of Jesus. "Forgive others as God has forgiven you," he said (Matthew 6:14-15). And then again, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute or offend you." (Matthew 5:44) We can add to Jesus' words the beautiful description of true love that the Apostle Paul gives us in 1 Corinthians 13: "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things."

It would be difficult to carry an attitude of being offended while committing to live by those verses! Let the rest of the world huff and puff and whine and be angry. Christ has given us a better way, if we, with humility and trust, commit to not being offended.

I kept this story from a magazine in the early nineties. It's amazing what you find when cleaning out some files...

Is there anything more powerful in the universe, outside of unconditional love, than an act of forgiveness? Take the incident at the Asian Art Museum in San Francisco. A group of monks from the monastery of the Dalai Lama worked for nearly a month at the creation of a six-foot-wide mandala made of colored sand ground from gemstones. It was to be the centerpiece of an exhibit called "Wisdom and Compassion: The Sacred Art of Tibet." People from around San Francisco came each day to watch the monks work silently, bending over a low platform as they laid out the intricate patterns that were to symbolize the cosmos.

The day before the mandala was to be completed, a woman jumped across the barriers and began destroying the mandala, shuffling it to smithereens with her feet while shouting something about "Buddhist death squads." A month's work by a whole community of monks was wiped out in a moment of insanity.

The reaction of the monks? "We don't feel any anger," said one. "We don't know how to judge her motivations. We are praying for her, for love and compassion."

*Gregg Levoy, who told this story in *The Sun*, added this comment: "The real teaching of the mandala turned out to be not in its execution, but in its demise, and its creators' response to its death. The monks reminded us that although to forgive is indeed divine, ordinary people can do it."*

Important 2025 Year End Giving Reminders

- All contributions for 2025 must be received by Wednesday, December 31 to be recorded on your 2025 giving statement. If you are mailing a year-end contribution, please be sure to mail it in time that we receive it prior to December 31st. Any contributions received after December 31, will be included on your 2026 giving statement.
- If you are considering a stock gift for 2025, please consider starting the process now. It can take a week or more for these transactions to be processed by the brokerages. If you are making a stock gift, please make sure you use our correct account at Fidelity to receive the gift. Laura in the finance office can provide this information to you. Also, please let Laura know that a gift is being sent so that we can be sure to credit it to the correct donor.
- If your address has changed during 2025, please make sure the church has your correct address as we prepare to mail your year-end giving statements.
- All expense reimbursements that relate to 2025 should be turned into the church office by December 31st. Any reimbursements requests related to 2025 received after December 31st may be applied to the 2026 budget rather than the 2025 budget.





SonZone Happenings!


Revolution


The Endowment Fund
