

2022 Holly Valley Hunter Jumper Schooling Series

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Check-In:

- Check-In for classes 1-25 begins at 7:45AM and ends at 9:00AM
- Check-In for classes 26-49 begins at 9:00AM and ends at 12:00PM.
- All riders must be checked in by 12:00PM.
- All scratch/adds must be reported by 12:00PM on show day.
- Riders will be assigned a show number for the 2022 show series at their first show. Riders must keep this number and use for each show in the 2022 series.
- Replacement numbers can be provided with a \$5.00 fee associated

General Rules:

- **CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS** must be shown or turned in when registering or a copy on file to participate in the show, No exceptions!
- **Trailers** must park inside gate to left of main barn or behind main barn, not on driveway. **No horses are to be taken across or into driveway.** You may take your horse around back of barn or **LEAD** through barn to get to different arenas.
- **Helmets** are mandatory for all classes and must be worn when mounted; helmets are to be ASTM/SEI approved. Chin straps are to be fastened at all times when mounted.
- Numbers must be worn any time rider is mounted.
- **STALLIONS** are not allowed at Holly Valley Equestrian Stable Schooling Shows nor on the grounds during events.
- Spectators may sit in grass paddock located near the announcer gazebo
- Visiting **DOGS** must be on a leash at all times! Dogs are not allowed in the barn, show holding area or arena. If causing a problem to horses or people, the dog may be asked to leave.
- Riders/Trainers are responsible for picking up ribbons from announcer gazebo

Splitting of Classes:

Show management reserves the right to combine, divide, or cancel classes at their discretion. Classes may be split to accommodate age and skill levels to maintain safety. In the event of a split, management will determine split **or** all riders will enter the arena and the judge will determine the split of the class. Group A will remain in the ring and group B will be judged as a separate group. Any act of discourtesy to judges, show management, or any other official of the show on the part of any owner, rider, parent, trainer, or groom will result in disqualification of any rider and/ or horse with which they are associated and no refunds will be made.

Attire:

Riders shall wear ASTM approved helmets at all times. Formal show attire is not required but may be worn. Breeches, jodhpurs/leggings worn with tall boots or paddock boots and a collared

polo shirt, tucked in with a belt are acceptable. Judging will be based on neatness of rider, not on attire. Hair should be contained in a bun, braid, hairnet, or rider's helmet for neatness and safety.

Eligibility For Year End Awards:

To be eligible for year/end awards, must have ridden in at least 3 shows during the season and must have completed at least **4 documented volunteer hours** helping at any of the 6 shows. For Medal Finals you must ride in a total of 3 Medal classes during season, work 4 hrs. at any season shows, be an LEA member. Points accumulated follow horse/rider pair!

Tack:

Hunter/Equitation classes Horses must be shown in a clean, adjusted hunter bridle with noseband with regulation English bit. In hunter classes a figure eight, flash or drop nose band is not allowed but is in Jumper classes. Standing martingales are optional in over fences. Running martingales and boots are allowed in Jumpers.

All Riders, Parents, and Trainers are responsible for reading and following rules and division and class specifications.

Rider/Horse Combination:

Stay in one height division- **NO** cross entering heights! Except in Jumper Classes you may cross heights. **Points follow horse & rider pair!**

Green Rider and Green Horse:

Green Rider and Green Horse entries MAY NOT go in any classes jumping over 18". Riders and horses who have competed in shows for 2 or more seasons are NOT eligible to participate in Green Rider and Horse divisions.

Hunter Over Fences:

Classes will be judged on the horse's performance, pace, jumping style, way of going and soundness.

Equitation:

On the flat and over fences will be judged on the rider's basic position, ability to control and the suitability of horse to rider.

Thoroughbred Class:

Open to only Thoroughbred Horses and will be judged as an English Pleasure Class. Judged on horse's manners, performance, quality & conformation.

Jumper Classes:

First two classes run as Table II 2b, Rider jumps designated course- if no faults, rider jumps the JUMP OFF course. Time + faults in jump off determine final placing. Third class in division runs as Table II 2a, rider will be timed during the course and placed by time and any faults.

Equitation Tests:

1. Halt (4-6 seconds) or Back
2. Hand Gallop (groups no larger than 6).
3. Figure 8 at a trot demonstrating correct change of diagonal.
4. Figure 8 at a canter on correct lead, demonstrating a simple change of lead.
5. Work collectively at the walk, trot, and canter.
6. Jump low obstacles at a trot as well as a canter.
7. Jump obstacles on a figure 8 course.
8. Answer questions regarding basic horsemanship, tack, and equipment and conformation.
9. Ride without stirrups, riders must have the option of crossing their irons.
10. Jump low obstacles at a walk as well as a canter (max height for walk is 2').
11. Dismount and mount individually.
12. Turn on the forehand.
13. Figure 8 at canter demonstrating a flying change of lead.
14. Execute a serpentine at a trot or canter demonstrating proper change of diagonal/lead.
15. Change leads on a line demonstrating simple or flying change of lead.
16. Canter on counter lead.
17. Turn on the haunches from the walk.
18. Demonstration ride of approximately 1 minute.
