Greetings to the Saints of St. Mark!

A gentle response defuses anger, but a sharp tongue kindles a temper-fire. (Proverbs 15:1)

June is here and June means summer - and summers in South Carolina are hot! In Greenwood, as in many other cities in our state, it is not unusual to see the temperature on display at a bank. I've seen it read in the mid 90's even in June. Add in the heat index, and it can feel like over 100 degrees. Most of us don't need to add the heat index to know it's hot. Just listen and you can hear folks talking about how hot it is and how they hate to go outside - much less do yard work - when it feels so hot.

We talk a lot about the temperature and thermometers in the summer because it is a way to measure the heat we are feeling. After all, that's what a thermometer is for - to tell us the temperature. It tells us how hot it is (or how cold it is in the winter and even our recent spring). Unfortunately, knowing how high the temperature is doesn't change how uncomfortable we feel. We just know it is hot! And as people complain and grouse about the mercury rising in the thermometer, I remember the words of Will Rogers. He said, "Everyone talks about the weather but no one does anything about it."

That's why I'm glad we don't just live in a world with thermometers but also thermostats. On a hot summer day in June, it is good to go home and turn the thermostat in the house down and cool off. The thermostat changes the temperature by cutting on the heat during the winter cold to warm us up or, in our case, to turn on the air conditioner to cool us off. Thermostats can make a difference. Whereas a thermometer can only tell us how hot (or cold) it is, it's the thermostat that can do something about it.

I think there is a message to us Christ-followers in all this. I believe God calls us to be thermostats and not thermometers. We all know there are plenty of people who are thermometers. They can tell you how bad things are, and how difficult a situation is, and are ready to complain when relationships are difficult. Thermometer people can tell you how "hot" it is - some do it quite loudly - but all their "hot air" doesn't do anything about the situation. Christ-followers are called to be God's thermostat in the situations of those around us. When tempers get heated in arguments, we are to speak the words of peace to "cool" things down. When a situation becomes difficult and people begin to panic, we are called to reflect our faith in God and keep our cool. Then, in the "heat of the moment," we can offer the "gentle words that defuse anger" as Proverbs 15 says. We offer fresh air of hope, faith, and wisdom that can dial things back when they heat up. Likewise, when relationships begin to turn cold due to hurts or wrongs, Christ calls us to bring the warmth of forgiveness to those in need. And to those frozen by loneliness and failures, we bring the balm of God's love and acceptance to help set them free from their "icy" isolation.

Christians are called by God and equipped by His grace to be thermostats in the world, making a difference and bringing change into the situations around us. I know it is easier to be a thermometer, just complaining or reporting the "heat" we feel. But instead, let us be thermostats. Let us be agents of change, of hope, of help, of love to a world of people needing relief. After all, you know sometimes it gets hot around here!

PRAYER QUILTS ARE FOR EVERYONE

The prayer quilt ministry initiated at St Mark is just a few months old, and we have already distributed almost twenty quilts!

Rivers Street and Coronaca attendees have not yet joined in requesting prayer quilts, and you are urged to do so. A prayer quilt requested by a Rivers Street and/or Coronaca attendee will hang in your sanctuary for knot-tying and prayers the Sunday after it is requested. These prayer quilts have a very positive effect on a recipient, letting them know that they are not alone and that others are praying for their well-being.

The criterion for receiving a prayer quilt is very simple: “I have a problem, and I need prayers.” That problem can be a physical or emotional issue, it can be due to an illness or an upcoming surgery, it can be because an individual is feeling overwhelmed by the trials of daily life and feel they need additional support—in other words, for any issue that makes a person feel they need prayer in their life.

As the coordinator of this ministry, I do not sit in judgment as to whether a person’s request for a prayer quilt should be honored. If a person feels the need for prayer, they will get it by the representation of prayers said and knots tied on a prayer quilt. No issue is too small to request a prayer quilt. We have quilts for all ages, even infants (although I hope I never have to use those!)

The only stipulation we have is that either the recipient or the recipient’s caregiver must give permission for the issue to be made known, and the recipient must be willing to receive the gift of prayer. We can be even more selective in our wording if a person’s issue is very personal—the recipient can simply say “I need a prayer quilt because I have an overwhelming issue in my life that I cannot handle alone.” If a woman, for example, is an abused wife/mother and has left the family home and fears for her safety, we will not give her last name if she so requests, nor will we disclose her location.

Monetary donations can be made via check made payable to St. Mark UMC and with the notation “Prayer Quilt Ministry.” I want to thank those individuals who have done this already. Donations of fabric can be made by delivering such donations to Sunni Bond at the Fellowship Class room (Bypass campus) on a Sunday or at the 11 a.m. service at Bypass—I am usually in the 2nd pew from the front, left-hand side! Several people have donated fabric, and it is greatly appreciated! The basic requirement is 2 yards each of two complementary fabrics, one for the front, one for the back. As long as you have 1-2/3 yds of fabric for each side, you are good—the extra is used for self-binding, but commercial binding can also be used.

I am sure that many of you right now can think of someone in your life—a relative, a friend, a neighbor—who might benefit from the gift of prayer. Ask their permission to have a prayer quilt dedicated to them, and let’s keep these prayer quilts moving!

“So Moses listened to his father-in-law and did all he had said.” (Exodus 18:24)

Greetings St. Mark!

In Exodus 18, Moses has been called upon by the Israelites to act as a judge; to hear their inquiries of God, their disputes, and to give guidance on the statutes and instructions of God. (Exodus 18:15-16). During this time, Moses also receives a visit from his father-in-law Jethro. Jethro is very intrigued by Moses' work, so he goes and watches Moses as he works. Jethro watches Moses for a little while then asks Moses, why is he working alone? Jethro also gives Moses his opinion of Moses and his job. “What you are doing is not good. You will surely wear yourself out, both you and these people. For the task is too heavy for you; you cannot do it alone.” (Exodus 18:17-18) While Jethro’s opinion and advice seem harsh, like the work that Moses is futile, but that is not the case.

Jethro reminded me so much of my father-in-law, especially if I started a home improvement project. One year, Amanda and I decided to extend our master bedroom closet. When my father-in-law found out, he was down from Charlotte the next day. He would start out by watching me work. Then would come the questions. “Joey, are you sure you want to knock out that wall? Do you think you need to cut the board in that direction?” Then finally I would hear, “If I were you I would.....” Within these words from my father-in-law there was no harshness or malice. The words spoken to me by my father-in-law were encouragement to make improvements, but also words of grace and guidance because I was quickly becoming overwhelmed by the renovation. And these are the words spoken to Moses by Jethro. He encourages Moses to continue to be God’s hands and feet among the people of Israel, while guiding him away from the potential burnout which would only lead to hurting himself and those he loves and serves. Thankfully, both Moses and I listened to our fathers-in-law. Moses continued on to Mt. Sinai and a new covenantal relationship with God and the people of Israel and I into a new working relationship with my father-in-law as we worked together to finish the closet.

Church, as we begin summer we may find ourselves taking on extra responsibilities at work, fitting in vacations, summer sports, etc. Let’s not forget to listen to our Heavenly Father, who encourages us to go be the church that he calls us to be. A church that watches, that questions, that grows in love and grace by the guidance of Jesus Christ, so that we may establish new relationships with each other and our community.



It gives us great pleasure to announce that all three of our pastors will be back for another year with St. Mark UMC. We are blessed to have three capable and caring pastors to serve us. Pastor Steve is an ordained elder in the UMC and entering the sixth year of his appointment with us. Pastor Joey is a local pastor who serves as our Parish Pastor. He is entering the second year of his appointment with us.

Congratulations to Robby Lybrand who will now be an officially Licensed Local Pastor in the South Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. This will take place at this year's Annual Conference to be held online on June 5-6. Local Pastors are not ordained but appointed to serve a particular church.
