

The Holy season of Advent, which leads us to the season of Christmas, is here. I do not know about you, but the season of Advent always fills my mind, heart, and life with great anticipation and hope. Every season of Advent, I spend time reflecting on the meaning of this holy season. I typically use this season as a time of much soul searching and intense

meditation of the hopefulness this season brings.

The season of Advent is made up of four weeks, including Sundays. The word *Advent* is derived from the Latin *adventus*, which means "coming." The entire season of Advent boldly proclaims the coming of Jesus. We spend this season anticipating our celebrating again the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day. However, until we reach Christmas Day, we are reminded that Jesus comes to us daily and continuously through the Word and the Spirit. Finally, we are reminded in this holy season of the hope and anticipation Jesus' church has, as we await His return in final victory. With these ways that Jesus promises to come to us, we are called to a time of soul searching and preparation for Jesus' coming and arrival to His church.

Above, is the first verse of one of my favorite Advent hymns, *O Come*, *O Come*, *Emmanuel*. The powerful words of this hymn declare the plea of God's people for rescue and hope during dark and trying times. With every refrain for every verse, the pleas turn to rejoicing of the promised hope that is on its way for God's people - the hope we await is none other than Jesus. *Emmanuel* (God is with us) is here and is coming to us daily to our rescue. The present and anticipated hope we have in Jesus coming to us reminds me of a passage of scripture from Romans, "What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us?"

As we journey together this Advent season, it is my hope each Sunday that we will gain a clearer realization of the hope we have in Jesus. We will hear about the hope, love, joy, and peace of Jesus as we light the candles of the Advent wreath each week. In addition at all three campuses, we will begin our Advent and Christmas sermon series, *The Thrill of Hope...A Weary World Rejoices*. I pray the anticipation and hope of Advent fills all of our minds, hearts, and lives this season.





Hello St. Mark Family!

It is one of my favorite times of the year. Lights are up on the houses, Christmas music is playing in the stores, the air is crisp and cool - it's just a great time! As all the decorations go up and the plans are made for what is sure to be a busy time of the year, I can't help but stop and think that we need to remember to slow down this Advent season. We need to make sure we are taking time to rest, to remember what this season is all about. We have just finished a sermon series on how we prepare for the return of Christ. that we miss out on what God is doing. I am reminded of the Christmas story in Luke's gospel. After the birth of Jesus, the shepherds came to see him, and it says:

¹⁵ When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶ And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. ¹⁷ And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. ¹⁸ And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. ²⁰ And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Even the shepherds were busy this time of year. They were excited for the birth of Christ, but they were in a hurry, much like we are most of the time. Now, one part that always reminds me to slow down is verse 19. But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. Mary took time to stop and reflect on what was being said to her, what had just happened, how what the angels had said to her had come true, everything. She took time to pause. After everything she had been through, traveling all that way, not having a room for them to stay in, sleeping in a barn, everything...she took time to pause.

So, are you taking time to pause? Are you taking time to slow down this Advent season and remember the reason for the season? I know it's easy to get caught up in the fast pace of the holidays. Earlier this week, the three pastors were sitting down looking over the calendar for December and everything we have going on in the church, and we realized very quickly that it's going to be a busy month. In all of that busyness, let's make sure we take time to pause and reflect. Let's make sure we take time to worship and praise. Let's make sure we take time to know how important this season is and how this season helps us to start new, fresh, refreshed, and ready for what the New Year will hold.

I hope you have a wonderful Christmas season filled with time of relaxation and time spent with family. Most of all I hope it's a season of renewal for yourself. From Jennifer, Jack, and myself, we hope you and your family have the Merriest of Christmases and the Happiest of New Years! We hope to see YOU at CHURCH! BRING A FRIEND!
