Jason's Journal

"Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, 'If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free...So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed.'" John 8:31-32, 36

Welcome to the month of July! I don't know about you, but when I think about the month of July or hear someone reference July I automatically think about celebrating July 4th. I think about all of the Independence Day festivities. am reminded of the great freedoms we have in the United States. I am reminded that we have these freedoms by the

grace of God, and the great sacrifice and service of the men and women in the United States Armed Forces. I am grateful for those who have sacrificed and served to maintain the freedoms of this country.


When I think about freedom I am reminded of the definition one can find in a dictionary. Freedom is defined as follows: *able to act at will*; *not under compulsion or* restraint; having personal rights or liberty; not enslaved or confined. With this definition, I consider the above passage of Scripture from John's Gospel. In the context of this passage, for some of the Jews who had believed in Jesus and were following him, Jesus gave them a word of encouragement to continue following his words so that they would be true disciples of Jesus. If one would continue in following his words they would continue in the truth of who Jesus is and that truth would make you free. Free from what, some may ask? As Jesus continued in his conversation he shared that if people would not follow his words, then they would be slaves to sin not living free from sin in their relationship with Jesus. What does all of this mean? It is only Jesus who can bring full freedom to our lives - freedom from our enslavement to sin. If we will trust in and follow the words of Jesus, it is then that Jesus will make us free, we will be free indeed!

St. Mark as we remember the great freedoms we are afforded each and every day in this great country in which we live, let us remember the greatest of freedoms freedom from sin as we follow the way of our Lord and Savior. Finally, I remember the closing line in our confession and pardon we share in our liturgy when we celebrate Holy Communion. The closing line states, *"Free us for joyful obedience, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."* I leave us with this question, in your life and my life, what does it mean to you to be *freed for joyful obedience*?

My son is taking a English class during the summer. So far he has done two papers. He has done an autobiographical paper and an academic essay. The final paper he has to write is a compare/contrast paper. Having never written this type of paper beforehand, my son came to me and asked does it mean to compare/contrast things. The simplest answer that I could come up with was to compare/ contrast things means that we have to talk about how things

are similar and different at the same time and how we learn and grow from these situations. My answer seemed to satisfy him and he is diligently working on this paper. Since that time I have been thinking about my answer in light of the church. How can we compare/contrast the church and what can we learn from an ever changing world? So let's look at two passages of scripture. The first comes from

Luke's Gospel. "When he had finished speaking, Jesus said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and let down your nets for a catch.' Simon answered, 'Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.' When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break." (Luke 4:36-5:14) This is the disciples call story. They have been out doing the hard work of fishing and the results from the night's work had not been fruitful. As they were packing up for the day to go home, Jesus comes into their lives for the first time. After proclaiming the good news of the Kingdom of God, Jesus looks at Simon and his fellow fishermen and tells them to go back out into the deep water, cast your nets and catch some fish. Simon, tired from the previous night's work, knowing that they did not catch any fish, without hesitation casts his net into the water and catches an abundance of fish. Now let's look at John's Gospel. "Jesus said to them, 'Children, you have no fish, have you?' The disciples answered him, 'No.' Jesus said to them, 'Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.' So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish." (John 21:5-6) This scripture is again part of the disciples call story, but it isn't the same. The disciples are now living in a world in which Jesus has been betrayed, placed on trial, wrongfully convicted, and crucified. During this time rumors are starting to spread that Jesus is alive and making contact with his disciples, yet not all of his disciples have experienced the Resurrected Jesus. Some, like Simon Peter, are looking for a sense of normalcy in a world that looks completely different. So he decided to go fishing. Again, this fishing trip produces no fish. Again, Jesus calls on Simon Peter and the disciples with him to cast their nets into the water, only this time do it on the opposite side of the boat. However, the disciples do not recognize Jesus. Yet, the still give it a try and once again they catch many fish, and once again recognize Jesus. St. Mark, this is what discipleship looks like. There will be times when we will see, we will know, and we will follow Jesus. There will be other times when we don't recognize Jesus, yet he will still call on us, even if it means doing something different, something we have never done before. In both cases, our call to discipleship is to trust Jesus. For when we trust Jesus, the work we do in Jesus' name we will catch many fish. St. Mark, what is Jesus entrusting us to do now?

Hello St. Mark Family!

Earlier this week I was reading an article that a newly deciphered manuscript dating back 1,600 years has been determined to be the oldest record of Jesus Christ's childhood. The piece of papyrus has

been stored in a university library in Hamburg, Germany, for decades, historians at Humboldt University said. The document "remained unnoticed" until Dr. Lajos Berkes, from Germany's Institute for Christianity and Antiquity at Humboldt University in

Berlin, and Professor Gabriel Nocchi Macedo, from Belgium's University of Liège, studied it and identified it as the earliest surviving document detailing Jesus Christ's childhood. The document translated by Berkes and Macedo was dated between the 4th and 5th century. The stories in the document are not in the Bible, the news release said, but the papyrus contains anecdotes that would have been widely shared in the Antiquity and the Middle Ages. The few words on the fragment describe a "miracle" that Jesus performed as a child.

I found all of this very fascinating. We seem to know everything about our world, and yet time and time again science and technology continue to reveal things that we did not know. As we continue to grow as a society we are learning more and more about our world and even about Jesus. All of this got me to thinking...God's story is not finished, not even close. Just as we are learning more and more every day about God and about Jesus and His life on this earth, the story of God is not even close to being finished. Furthermore, with the continued writing of God's story, we are all a part of it. We are all playing a role in the story. We all are a piece to the puzzle. I find that exciting!


At the same time I wonder, what part of the story are we writing? When people read our part of the story, what will they read? Will they read of a people that cared for each other, that cared for our community, that cared for God's creation - or will they read of a people that turned our backs on each other and this earth? Paul reminds us of what our story should look like in Philippians 2:3-11.

³ Don't let selfishness and prideful agendas take over. Embrace true humility, and lift your heads to extend love to others. ⁴ Get beyond yourselves and protecting your own interests; be sincere and secure your neighbors' interests first. ⁵ In other words, adopt the mind-set of Jesus the Anointed. Live with His attitude in your hearts.

We are writing a special story. We are writing a story that can show the world that we are a people that loves God and each other. We can be the ones that are writing a story that shows the world that we have taken on the mindset of Jesus. To glorify God in all we do and to care for those around us. What an amazing story it is and how blessed we are to be a part of it.


